You and Your Pet

(Prepared under the auspices of the Southern Oregon Humane Society)

Twenty minutes before game time on an August night in 1950, boisterous fans in Yankee Stadium roared their surprise and approval. Out of the Yankee dugout had marched a trim young woman followed by two dozen smart-stepping dogs and their alert handlers.

Carrying black pennants, the dogs walked around the infield and faced the grandstand. In unison their pennants flipped, spelling out "Red Sox - Yankees" in yellow letters.

While the young woman provided explanatory commentary on the loudspeaker, the dogs, all graduates of obedience schools, demonstrated what an average dog can learn. They retrieved baseballs, jumped obstructions, even picked the "R" for Red Sox and "Y" for Yankees out of a miscellany of letters dumped on the ground.

In Outfield

In the outfield, a shepherd, a poodle and a Weimaraner sat unmoving while thousands of bleacherites tried to distract them with whistles and calls. As a climax the entire line of dogs, again carrying their pennants, leaped three barriers, joined their handlers and marched back to the dugout with West Point precision--all without a single spoken command. It was, a sports columnist observed, the only performance in Yankee Stadium to draw more cheers than a home run by Joe DiMaggio.

On a smaller scale this scene is duplicated several times a week in cities and towns throughout the United States. For obedience training--the schooling of family pets to be well-behaved companions--has become one of the most popular and rewarding hobbies of the dog world. A world that includes some 22 million dogs and more than 17 million dog-loving families.

A dog that has been obedience-trained differs from his untutored cousins mainly in good manners. He doesn't greet guests boisterously, muddying their clothes with dirty paws. When he climbs onto the wrong chair a simple "NO" or "Shame" gets him down. On shopping tours he will sit outside stores until his master returns.

The most common and most exasperating fault of the untrained dog is not to come when called. Letting a dog out for his final run on a cold or rainy night can be unpleasant when the dog decides to investigate the doings of nocturnal neighbors. But an obedience-trained dog comes on call instantly.

Peace of Mind

What a dog gets out of obedience training is peace of mind. An untrained dog is often confused because he

simply as judged by human standards, because they make absolutely no sense to the dog. The dog cannot possibly understand why he should sit, heel, lie down or pick up distasteful objects in his mouth. He doesn't know of any need for good manners. He wants only praise and affection from his master. To win that almost any healthy dog will try anything he can comprehend. That is the secret.

The things the dog learns are remarkable, despite their

A dog's schooling can begin

as early as six months of age. Though breeds differ in adaptability, any dog is almost certain to benefit. Owners benefit, too--particularly children entrusted with the training of their pets. The need for patience, understanding and tactful firmness helps to overcome youthful shyness and awkwardness, and brings out surprisingly mature qualities.

Thoughtful dog breeders and judges agree that while obedience training is still in its infancy its success so far is causing an entirely new attitude toward dogs to develop. For long, indulgent owners have affectionately tolerated dogs which were a nuisance--and sometimes a menace--to everyone else.
