

Press Club Honors UPI Correspondent

New York (UPI)—Joseph Taylor of United Press International has received the George Polk Memorial award of the Overseas Press club for his courageous coverage of the overthrow of the Venezuelan government of Marcos Perez Jimenez.

The award was one of 10 presented in as many categories of news coverage at a dinner Saturday.

The Polk award, named for a Columbia Broadcasting system correspondent killed in Greece and consisting of a

plaque and \$500, is presented for the best reporting requiring exceptional courage and enterprise abroad. Taylor, was cited for great risks he took in getting the story of the government overthrow, transmitting it through heavy censorship and continuing on the job at great personal danger.

When Death Finally Comes As A Friend

As I have said before in this column, we physicians and many laymen, will some day have to do a little thinking. Then we may see that it is often not a kindly deed to keep an old and pain-racked person alive for years after he wants to go, and perhaps after the Good Lord is ready to take him. I will never forget the sweet woman, with a very bad heart, who was a patient of mine some 40 years ago. For perhaps two years she kept begging me to keep her alive, because she had a terrible fear of death. As a child, she had been so frightened with word-pictures of hell that she could see and feel the flames. I never knew a person who so feared dying.

Hence it was later I was deeply impressed when she began to tell me to stop giving her heart tonics. She said the constant torture of trying to get her breath, plus the spells of agony due to the severe anginal pains which kept coming in her chest, had worn her down. Life had become so great a burden that she wanted no more of it; she wanted to lay it down. The tortures of this life had caused her to lose her fears of the promised tortures in the next life. She had the hope that perhaps the Great Judge would say that she had already suffered enough to pay

for whatever sins she might have committed. Fortunately, soon after, Mother Nature grew kind, and my sweet patient went to sleep gently, and never woke up—on this earth. I got to thinking of her today as I re-read Olive Schreiner's letter to her sister Ettie, when for two years Ettie had been suffering tortures—trying to die with much the same type of heart disease that Olive had. For many years, Olive had suffered so much that at last she became tired of living. She wrote, "It is so beautiful that death, which in the time of one's strength and youth, one instinctively draws back from, because it seems so cold, should come at last as the mighty comforter. When all courage fails me and my knees give way, I think of that quiet mountain top at 'Krantz Plaats' where I shall rest at last with my little baby beside me."

Recovery Claims Bill Is Referred

Salem—UPI—House Bill 503, permitting the state welfare commission to file claims against an injured workman for recovery of welfare payments made during the course of a court trial, was referred by the Senate Friday to the Judiciary committee.

Sen. Dan Dimick (D-Roseburg) said there were a number of sections of the bill that were vague and he particularly wanted to find out if the provisions of the bill were aimed at the industrial accident commission.

If so, he said, there would be some complications because under the law governing workmen's compensation payments, there is a provision barring any liens or garnishments of such payments.

No objection to the referral was made by Sen. Robert Straub (D-Springfield), who carried the bill on the floor. He said he felt it was proper for the welfare commission to recover any payments made to the injured workman during the trial after payment of medical and collection costs had been deducted.

Headache Victim In Grave Condition

Los Angeles—UPI—A 45-year-old man Friday said he was so tormented by headaches that he threw himself head first out of a second story apartment twice in a frenzy of pain. Mario Sanchez, a meat packer, had his first plunge broken when he hit a bush. He was helped back to the apartment by his wife, Concha, 41, and son, Mario Jr., 21. But the pain persisted and he again hurled himself out the window.

He struck a cement sidewalk with his head on his second plunge. Doctors at Memorial hospital said Sanchez was in grave condition with a possible fractured skull.

Court in Texas Holds 'Family Day'

Fort Worth, Texas—UPI—It was "family day" Friday in county criminal court.

Mary "Ma" Floyd joined her daughter, Dorothy Jean Westfall, 32, and her son, James "Peaches" Floyd, 34, before Judge J. C. Duvall on trial for theft.

Mrs. Floyd was convicted of theft charges last June, but the judge suspended a jail sentence when she promised to go to Arizona and never return. She didn't keep her promise, and was picked up for shoplifting Thursday.

Floyd and his sister were already being held for theft. Duvall said he might as well take the whole family at once.
