

Driving Habits Should Be Adjusted to Weather

The sudden change from harsh winter to soft spring weather requires a complete adjustment of driving habits, according to Chief Charles P. Champlin of the Medford police department.

The chief remarked that many families take advantage of the first warm week end to get into their cars and head for the open road. Too often, he noted, the driver has been recently driving only in city traffic under adverse weather

conditions. A dry road and a balmy day are an invitation to drive too far before turning back, he continued. The result, he said, is a tired family, and an increasing tendency to hurry the trip home. Sudden darkness after sunshine and a heavy traffic flow, make fast driving perilous, especially when the driver is not accustomed to the type of traffic.

The most common hazards besides road fatigue, he said, are following the car ahead too closely and trying to be first in line, which results in the driver weaving in and out of his lane of traffic in an attempt to gain the head of the line and save what amounts to only a few minutes at best.

Chief Champlin offered this suggestion to the drivers of Medford. "If your family enjoys traveling in the car, condition yourself to fair weather changes in road and traffic conditions by starting with short trips and gradually increasing the distance each time."
