George McUne to Accompany Area Wagon on Journey

"On to Oregon Cavalcade" headquarters in Roseburg has announced that Wagon Master Gordon Serpa, Ashland, has selected George McUne, owner of the Court St. Repair Shop, Medford, to accompany the Jackson county wagon on the journey from Missouri to Oregon this summer.

McUne has lived in the northwest most of his life, having grown up in Washington. He has lived in Oregon for the past 33 years, and has owned and operated the Court St. Repair Shop, 1158 Court st., for the past 15 years. He and his wife, Esther, have four children.

His hobby, besides hunting and fishing, is horses. He has spent much time breaking horses and building horse-drawn wagons. He now owns three wagons, one covered, one logging wagon, and one freight wagon.

To pursue his hobby of hunting, he takes annual trips, some as much as a month long, each fall. He has made two moose hunting trips to Canada and frequent trips elk hunting in Oregon.

Refer Re-elected to Insurance Board

Raymond R. Reter, Reter Fruit company, Medford, was re-elected to the board of directors of the Insurance Company of Oregon at the fifth annual meeting in Portland recently.

He is one of 23 directors of the company, which reported a premium income of \$1,639,000 during 1958. John Merrifield, president, said the figure represents a 56.9 per cent increase over 1957.

Stockholders voted to increase capitalization from 80,000 to 200,000 common shares. The increase in capitalization is necessary for further expansion, Merrifield said.

Two new directors were elected. They are Larry Hilaire, Portland restaurant operator, and Elmo Smith, former governor.

Estacada Gun Test Reported at Trial

Oregon City - (UPI) - A gun which killed Hector Anders, 56, fired defectively twice in 100 trials, a technician testified Wednesday at the murder trial of Anders' son.

Ralph Prouty, technician at the state police crime laboratory, said his tests showed that the .22 rifle could have gone off twice in 100 times by a simple drop of the gunstock on the floor.

The victim's son, Duane Anders, 17, is on trial for first degree murder. He said he slipped in the family barn and that an accidental shot struck his father.

The defendant was a student leader at Estacada high school. He is charged with killing his father the night of Feb. 8 and setting fire to the family barn to hide it.

Library Board Asks for Loan Of Bookmobile

The Medford Public library board of trustees voted to ask the state library for the loan of a demonstration bookmobile, and funds to operate it, at a meeting this week.

The board voted to take action to obtain the approval of the county court for the project.

Miss Helen Webster, Jackson county librarian, said the unit could be obtained on a two-year loan from the state, using funds available from state and federal grants for rural library service. Miss Eloise Ebert, state librarian, indicated to Miss Webster that the state would look favorably on the application of Jackson county for the bookmobile.

The bookmobile would complement the activities of the branches in the county system, attempting to reach the 33,000 people in the county not within easy access of a branch library, according to Miss Webster. The unit would also act as a source of books for school children during the summer months who are not close to a branch of the main library.

The library has on file an application from a former Medford resident for a position as driver of a bookmobile. Miss Webster said the bookmobile, if obtained, would be manned by a combination driver-clerk. The approval of the action by the Trustees came at the regular monthly meeting. All but one member of the board member was present.
