National Science Foundation Sponsor Of Program Series

Corvallis — Plans for a nationwide series of summer science training programs for outstanding high school students have been announced by the National Science Foundation with Oregon State college selected as the school to offer the training in the Northwest.

The Oregon State college summer program will be June 14 to 27 with 100 high school boys scheduled to attend. A National Science Foundation grant will pay for all tuition fees, living expenses, and some travel expenses for the boys picked to participate.

Purpose of the experimental nationwide program is to "encourage the scientific interests of high school students of high ability" by giving them a college orientation in to career possibilities and science study programs. It is a part of the NSF program to increase the number of top-flight scientists and teachers in the U.S.

In Charge of Program

Dr. F. A. Gilfillan, dean of science, will be in charge of the program at OSC.

Boys from throughout the region are eligible to apply for the training program with preference given to boys who will complete their junior

year of study this spring. OSC will be the only institution in Oregon, Washington or Idaho giving the training.

Students interested in applying for the training program at OSC should write Dean Gilfillan for application blanks. Detailed information on the program will be furnished to all northwest high schools. Students finally selected must be recommended by their high school principal or science teachers.

Course work will cover all fields of science. OSC professors will be instructors. Boys will have a chance to observe nuclear instruments such as the nuclear reactor and cyclotron and to visit campus research laboratories.

Coordination Planned

The NSF experimental program at OSC will be coordinated with the Junior Engineers and Scientists Summer Institute for high school boys scheduled at the same time.

JESSI is sponsored by Scientists of Tomorrow, a non-profit Portland corporation formed in 1955 to promote interest in science, in conjunction with the college. Some 200 boys are expected for this year's fourth annual JESSI program, which was started at OSC and now has been adopted

ed in other areas of the nation.

Boys pay their own expenses under the JESSI program, but some scholarship aid is available from industrial grants to the program. The JESSI program has won wide praise for its contributions in encouraging promising high school boys and girls to prepare for careers in science.

The OSC program under the National Science Foundation grant will be one of some 100 similar training sessions at leading U.S. colleges. Various types of programs will be offered. They will vary in length from 10 days to 12 weeks; some will be limited to just one branch of science, especially mathematics; two will operate on Saturdays throughout the year; and some will be operated just for high school students who can commute to the college campus for work.

All told, about 6,000 students will take part in the \$1,600,000 program, Dean Gilfillan said.

Red China's Kiddie-Car Set In 'Work-While-You-Study' Plan

Tokyo — (UPI) — Red China, which "liberated" more than 50 million women from the kitchen so they could work in fields and factories, now is going after the kiddie-car set.

A Radio Peiping broadcast said the regime has introduced a four-hour work week for primary school children, 9 to 12 years old.

High school and college students have been compelled to do manual labor regularly for at least two years, but until now Peiping had not systematically organized primary school children.

Between 40 and 45 million school children in the 9-to-12 age bracket are affected by the new "work-while-you-study" program.

Another 10 to 15 million children of primary school age who live in rural areas where there are no schools work full-time at light chores in their communities.

Program Revised

Radio Peiping said schools

across the mainland have revised their teaching program for this year to make room for the manual labor program.

"Primary school students from the age of 9 up must

begin to take part in limited manual work," the broadcast said, "in general not more than four hours a week."

Junior high school students, 12 to 15 years old, have been ordered to do six hours of manual labor a week. Senior high school students, 15 to 18, have been put on an eight-hour week. There are 15 million Chinese children in the high schools.

students, who number 790,000, the routine is to work from two to four months each year, with the average much closer to four months than to two.

These are the working hours for students in "full-time" schools. Many of Red China's primary schools, high schools and colleges, however, are "half-day" or "spare-time" schools, where the routine is much tougher.

Half-and-Half System

Peiping gave no estimate of the number of youngsters currently enrolled in these schools but said that "in half-day schools, students study for half a day and work for half a day, or study and work on alternate days or alternate weeks."

"Under our educational system," Radio Peiping explained, "education and production, mental and physical labor go hand in hand."

When high school and college students were ordered to do manual labor, the regime said the object was "to wipe out the distinction between mental and physical labor."

Students in the higher grades were making this distinction

too often for Peiping's taste, and developing a dislike for manual work.

Different Approach

A slightly different approach is being tried out on the 9-year-olds.

"Elementary courses are being strengthened," Radio Peiping said, "to achieve a balance in practical work and theoretical knowledge."

Last year Peiping reported that "progressive-minded" youngsters in some parts of the country had organized "kindergarten communes." These children, ranging from 5 to 15 years in age, collected scrap metal and made simple tools.

Officials said these ventures

were purely voluntary, initiated by the youngsters themselves.

The manual labor program for 9-year-olds, however, is a mandatory affair, organized in Peiping and blessed by the Communist Party.

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
