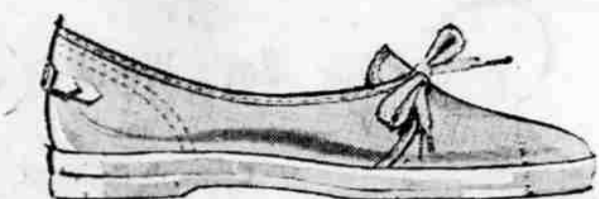


### Class of 1944 Plans Reunion

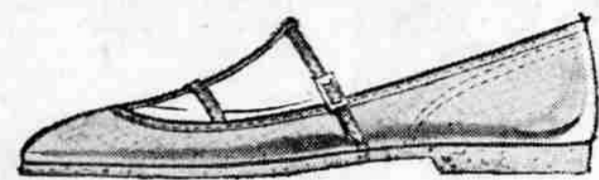
