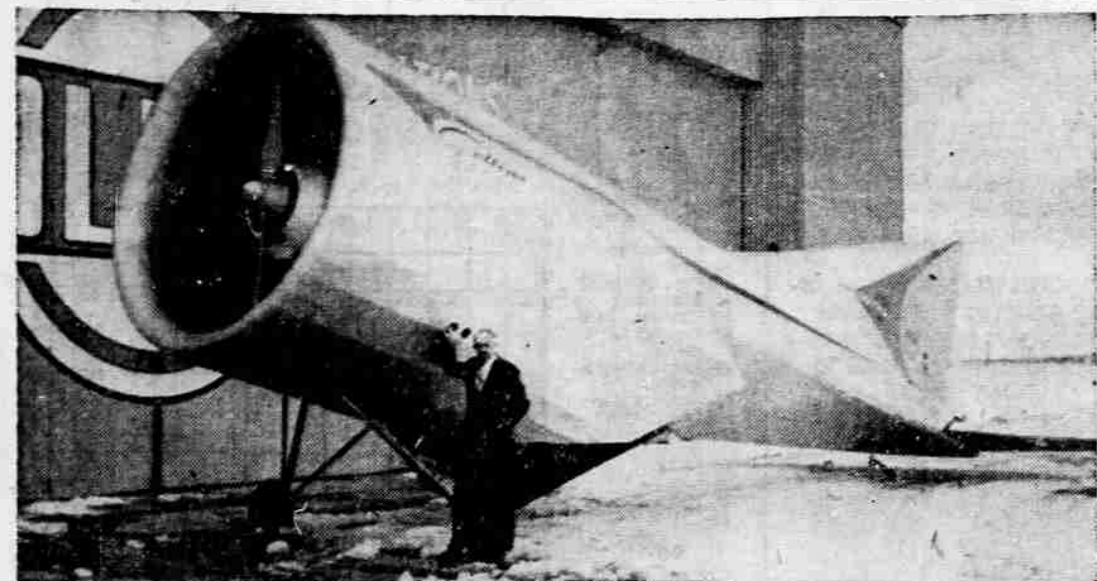

Pacific Telephone has just completed the installation of additional telephone switching equipment in the Central Point central office, according to Manager J. H. Creager. The installation makes it possible to meet the continued growth in the Central Point exchange. The central office served 1327 phones in April, 1958. There are now 1790 telephones in Central Point. Western Electric installation forces were engaged in the six-week project of installing the new switching equipment. There were from two to four men in the central office building for the past six weeks, Creager said. Installing the new switching equipment cost the telephone company \$18,000.

Local Witnesses Return From Circuit Meeting

Completing three full days of gaining new spiritual inspiration and sharing their faith and beliefs with others, Jehovah's Witnesses concluded their "Be a Teacher of the Good News" circuit convention Sunday. Three Men Killed During L.A. Robbery

Los Angeles - (UP) - Two suspected robbers and a police officer were killed late Sunday night in a blazing 15-minute gun battle at a market.

About 40 policemen surrounded the market and took part in the battle which raged in the almost-darkened store after Police Officer Charles Bogardus was shot when he entered the store earlier to investigate a robbery call.

Police discharged a barrage of shots to cover two ambulance drivers who braved possible wounds to run in the store and carry out the wounded officer who fell with a gunshot wound in the head, according to radio newsmen Lloyd Perrin.

Bogardus was taken to Central Receiving hospital where he died early today.

The slain gunmen were identified as Howard Grant, an ex-convict, and Nathaniel Banks.
