

### Adenauer Accepts Presidential Bid

Bonn, Germany—(UPI)—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer, 83, has accepted the nomination of his Christian Democratic Union for the presidency of West Germany, it has been officially announced.

Eugen Gerstenmaier, president of the lower house of Parliament and a deputy chairman of the CDU, said Adenauer was nominated unanimously by a 60-member party committee this morning.

Adenauer accepted the nomination immediately. Gerstenmaier said.

He will thus exchange his post of chancellor, a position of great power, for one with little more than symbolic worth.

When Children are very Cruel. I often have marveled at the terrible cruelty shown by small children who torment another child who is crippled or disabled in some way. An unhappy mother writes me about the serious problem faced by her little girl who has the birthmark on her face. The parents have taken the child to several physicians who cannot agree on any treatment. The poor child hates to go to school because some of the children in her class refuse to associate with her or play near her; they tell her that her spot is catching; some hit her, and some, when she comes near, call her stinky and hold their nose.

Naturally, the child is broken-hearted over all this persecution. The parents placed her in another school to see if conditions there would be any better, but they weren't good enough. Then, the tormented child started striking back, and that made her even more unpopular. Whenever children see that the butt of their teasing is taking it hard, they derive all the greater pleasure from their devilment. As the parents say, this sort of thing is changing for the worse the character and temperament of their child.

Would Be Accepted. I imagine that if the child could for a while ignore the teasing and manage to stay pleasant and friendly, (not easy!) she soon would be accepted and the bullies would turn to pick on someone else. I suspect this would happen if only because when I was a child in grammar school I was jeered at because I was thin and had to wear heavy glasses. I was called "fat man" and "four eyes." I was jeered at also because my father was a foreigner. I imagine that because I always have been good-natured, I didn't pay much attention to the teasing and the hazing. I laughed, and this took all the steam out of the teasers. Soon they quit trying to bother me because there wasn't enough fun in it!

I think all parents and teachers ought to make a great effort to convince their children that one of the dirtiest, meanest, cruelest and most cowardly things anyone can do is to pick on a child who, through no fault of his, is crippled or deformed or disabled in some way. Many of us who are grown up would do well to learn not to call people by nick-names which must always be distressing—nicknames such as shorty, lumpy, squinty or fatty.
