

200 Officials to Attend Regional Education Session

More than 200 governors, state legislators, college and university presidents and other state officials will attend a regional workshop on "Quality and Opportunity in Higher Education" this week in San Francisco.

Frank VanDyke, Medford attorney and former chairman of the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education, will leave today for the meeting.

Featured speakers at the workshop will include Dr. Alvin E. Eurich, vice president for the Fund for the Advancement of Education, and Fred M. Hechinger, author of "The Big Red School House," a study of Russian education today.

To Read Speech
VanDyke will preside over a one-day session on "The Budget Process in State Colleges and Universities," and also read a speech by John R. Richards, chancellor of the Oregon State System of Higher Education, who will be unable to attend due to legislative activities.

The workshop is sponsored by the Western Interstate Commission, the Western Governors' conference and the Council of State Governments. It will be the second annual meeting of western leaders in state government and higher education to discuss problems facing public universities and colleges in this region.

The budget session will consider the uses and limitations of "formulas" in assigning funds to public higher education systems now used by Colorado, Texas, Oklahoma, California and Washington.

The Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education will hold its annual meeting in Medford Aug. 8-10, Van Dyke reported.

Colonel to Head UO Department

Eugene-Colonel Horace D. Neely, a native of Mapleton and a graduate of the University of Oregon, will become head of the military and air science department here in October.

He will replace Col. M. I. Carter. Both are Air Force officers. Colonel Neely is currently assigned to Headquarters of the Air Forces in Germany. He served in the Pacific theater during World War II and holds the Legion of Merit and Commendation medal.

Colonel Neely was graduated from the university in 1934 with a bachelors degree in business administration. He will have academic rank of professor of air science in the university.

Lakeview Area Water Supply Short

Lakeview (UPI)—The annual water forecast meeting here Tuesday reported a short water supply for the south-central Oregon farm lands and portended an early fire season.

W. T. (Jack) Frost, Oregon snow survey supervisor, said mountain snow packs are holding only 42 per cent normal moisture for the area.

Farmers and ranchers who irrigate from natural stream flow were advised to use careful water management to stretch their supply this summer.

Lake county extension agent Oris Rudd suggested farmers make use of the natural stream flow as soon as it becomes available to avoid waste. He said supplies also can be conserved by shorter irrigation runs and by using more spreader ditches in fields.
