Help For Those Once Mentally Disturbed

As I will keep saying in this column, one of the disgraceful things about our civilization is our cruel behavior to the patient who has just been released from a mental hospital. No one will want to give him a job. The minute an employment manager learns that he has been in a mental hospital, he says, "We will keep your name on file and will call you if anything shows up." But why this fear of a man who has been cured of insanity? He is not likely ever to become violent or to hurt anyone working along side of him. He may be a bit difficult or tired at times, but who isn't? If his boss will only be kind, and will occasionally make allowances, the man probably will settle down to become a good workman.

I never knew how impossible it is for a man just out of a mental hospital to get a job until I read Mrs. Hackett's book, "The Cliff's Edge" (McGraw-Hill). There she tells how when her fine husband got out of the hospital, he walked the streets for weeks hunting a job, and no one would take him even as a common laborer. Eventually, the only job that he, a well-trained executive, could find open to him was that of a gravedigger. As Mrs. Hackett said, if a person who had never been insane had been treated that cruelly, he might well have lost his reason.

Today, in a few cities the people are facing this miserable situation and are opening "protected" shops in which people recently out of a mental hospital, are given work that they can perform, for wages. In such a shop there are kindly and trained people who will help the person who perhaps fears that he is slipping back a bit toward his old psychosis.

Pondosa Becomes Nation's Center

Pondosa, Ore. — (UP) — The new geographic center of the United States is a "ghost" town that goes up for sale next month.

A California firm said Pondosa, in Eastern Oregon, will be the geographic center of the United States when Hawaii is formally admitted to the union.

But the glory came too late. The old lumber town is on the auction block.

The mill which supported the town of 250 residents closed March 6 after 32 years. Most of the residents have moved away and the streets are nearly deserted.

There was no mayor to receive the word when Research Publications, Inc., San Carlos, Calif., announced its findings. The homes, mill and other structures and equipment here go on sale May 5.
