Russian Rushed To Anchorage

Juneau, Alaska - (AP) - A Coast Guard cutter today rushed toward Cold Bay in the Aleutians carrying an injured and unconscious Russian seaman destined for hospitalization at Anchorage.

The cutter Storis was scheduled to meet a Coast Guard plane which was to take Evgenij Ivanovich Gneushev, 23, to the 5040th Wing Hospital at Elmendorf Air Force Base, Anchorage. Gneushev was taken aboard the Storis late Wednesday afternoon at Akun Bay from the Russian refrigerator ship Pischavaya Industriya.

A Navy doctor aboard the Storis, Lt. D. H. Yarley, said the Russian was suffering from flaccid paralysis of the right arm and legs.

The Russian, who Yarley said badly needs hospitalization, had a temperature of 105 and a pulse of 114 when he was taken aboard the Storis. He was injured several days ago when he fell into a hold on the refrigerator ship.

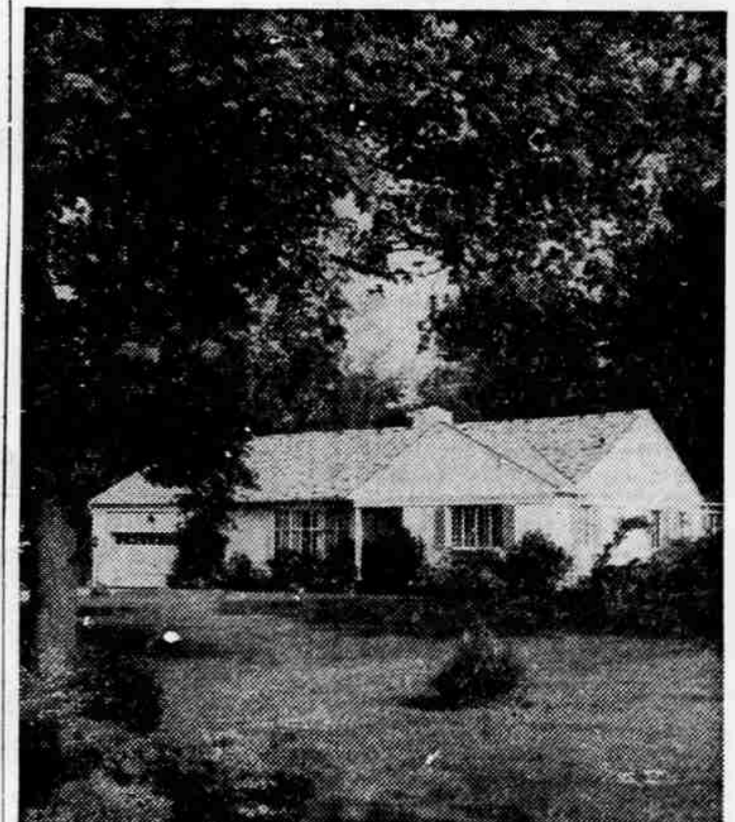
