

Two Ceremonies Planned by Liz

Hollywood —(UPI)— Elizabeth Taylor and Eddie Fisher will be married by Rabbi Max Nussbaum after all, but only after the couple is wed in a civil ceremony in Nevada.

The 27-year-old actress learned this week that a Nevada marriage performed by the rabbi who officiated at her conversion rites last week when she became a Jew would not be recognized by the state. So the couple decided to be wed by a justice of the peace and then have Rabbi Nussbaum perform a religious ceremony.

"Nothing has been said about time or place," Nussbaum said.

Family Council

Maria S. — He doesn't want my mother at my wedding.
Mr. J.S. — It could cause trouble.

Maria S. — I have about the worst problem I've ever heard. I am 21 and about to get married in a few months and my father doesn't want me to have my mother to the wedding.

My parents were divorced when I was five years old and my mother had a mental breakdown two years later. Since then she had been in and out of hospitals and I have lived with my father and stepmother.

I don't see my mother often as it upsets her, but I feel she would be happy to know about the wedding and I haven't even told her. I'm sure she'll feel bad if she finds out afterwards. My fiancée's parents have been told she is in the hospital with a nervous breakdown. They are always asking questions about her and I think that if she is well enough she should meet them.

Mr. J.S. — Maria has an idea that she'll quiet her fiancée's parents' fears if her mother makes an appearance, but I'm afraid it will have the opposite effect. We have given them to understand that her illness is of a temporary nature, but this isn't quite true. This illness has been going on for 14 years. At times, my former wife seems to be making a good recovery and rebuilding her life. But suddenly she'll go off and one never knows what is going to ignite the fuse.

Right now Maria's mother is out of the hospital. She is living with a friend and holding a job. At times like these she appears to be a nice sensible person, but how do we know whether this impression will hold up for the prospective in-laws. The excitement of the wedding could do things.

The Council: The basic problem here is really that of how to cope with Maria's background. The question of the attendance of the mother at the wedding is a smaller issue and can be worked as a result of Maria's coming to terms with some basic questions.

Maria is now uneasy because she is starting her married life on a lie. She would like to prove that her mother is not seriously ill, but can't be sure of her ability to do this.

The issue is certainly not simple. We can't tell Maria, "Just tell the truth and all will be well." All may not be well. Yet we fear it may eventually be more difficult for Maria to live with her untruth.

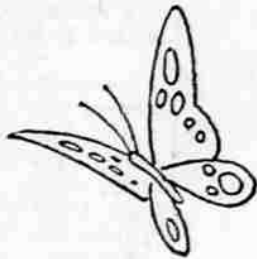
The doctor who best knows the case of Maria's mother may hold the answer to many of Maria's problems. Probably she is worried about the possibility of mental illness turning up in herself and her children and she should discuss this with him. Very likely, she will get reassurance and some sensible advice on this score. This in itself will be a help to her in living a healthier life. When she is clear on these points in her own mind, Maria may want to discuss the issue openly with her fiancée.

If the fiancée is not reassured by Maria's own honesty and self-confidence, or if his parents are not reassured and have great influence with him, Maria might be better off without such a marriage. Another man might be more understanding and more willing to enter such a marriage with his eyes open.

Once Maria and her fiancée understand and trust one another, they can decide together whether it would be best to have the mother at the wedding. On this question, too, it would be advisable to consult the doctor.

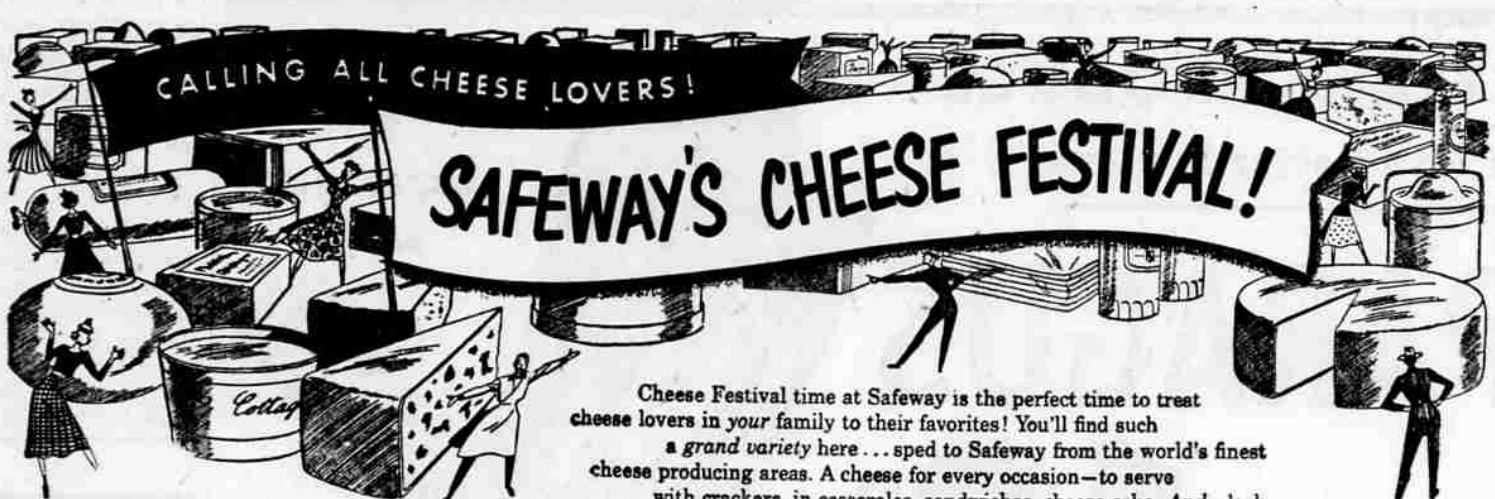

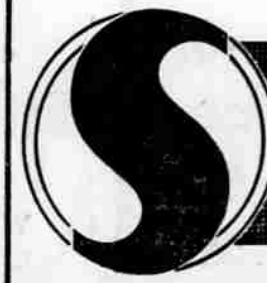
