Financing Told On Farm Loans For Building

Farm building improvements may now be financed through Farm-Housing loans, Eugene Denney, the local supervisor for Farmers Home Administration, stated this week.

The improvements may be construction, repair and remodeling of houses and other farm buildings. The financing, Mr. Denney said, is limited to buildings that are not in excess of those economically essential to the farm. Also, this authority does not permit refinancing of debts or payment of any bills incurred prior to loan approval.

The terms for the loans are favorable, Denney added. Repayment periods run up to 33 years with interest at 4 per cent, the actual period being adjusted to family resources. All farm-housing loans must be adequately secured by a real estate lien, which may, however, be a second mortgage.

Plan Explained

The local county committee certifies the eligibility of a family and gives their recommendation for a loan. An applicant, to be eligible, must own a farm unit of such size and production that it is considered a farm unit and not a rural residence. The minimum size has been lowered so that a unit producing at least \$400 worth of commodities based on 1944 prices may qualify. As with other loans, the family must show that their credit needs cannot be obtained from other sources on terms they can be expected to meet.

Applicant families choose their own building plans, hire their own carpenters or contractors and purchase materials where they please. They must provide plans and specifications which will adequately show the job to be done and that construction standards will be met. Also, Denney pointed out, families are encouraged to contribute as much of their own labor as they can in the construction. In many cases, houses on farms are constructed for less than comparable houses in town.

Harney Basin Lacking Water

Burns - (UPI) - The worst irrigation season in 15 years is in sight for Harney Basin ranchers, it was reported Wednesday at the annual water forecast meeting here.

Oregon Snow Survey Supervisor W. T. Frost said the mountain snow pack is only 48 per cent of normal. He added that lower elevation snow already has melted without bringing any sizable amount of water.

Some 85,000 acres of meadow hay land is expected to produce only one-third of normal crop. Water holes and small stock ponds are either dry or low and the three largest streams in the county are forecast to run below normal.

County Extension Agent Ray Novotny suggested culling herds to conserve water and wide use of water in irrigation.

'Pioneers' Leave For Independence

Eugene - (UPI) - A group of modern pioneers left here by bus today for a trip to Kansas City. The return trip will take them 130 days.

They are members of the "On to Oregon Cavalcade" who will return in six covered wagons along the old Oregon trail to help publicize the state's centennial.

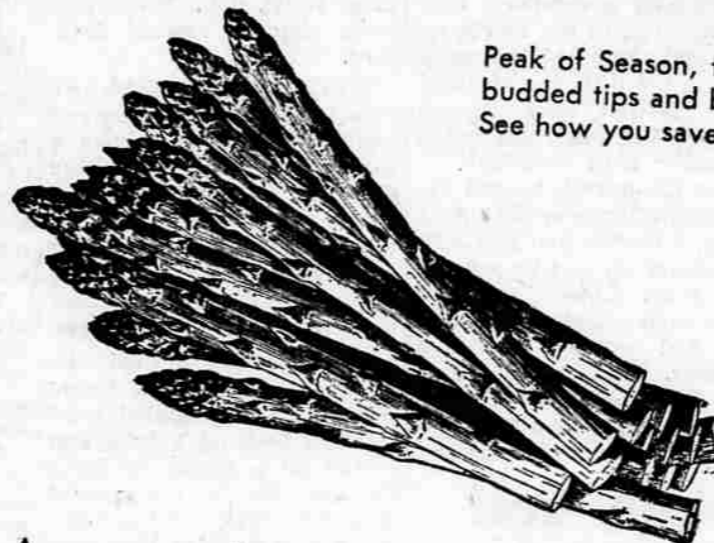
