Vandenberg Missile Firings Scheduled

Los Angeles — (UPI) — The Air Force has tentatively set this week for launching on the West Coast two powerful ballistic missiles.

One of the shots will be a Discoverer II earth satellite which might carry an instru-

ment capsule into the outer atmosphere and reject it in an attempted recovery project.

The other shot will be a Thor intermediate range ballistic missile fired for the first time by a Royal Air Force

missile crew now in training at Vandenberg Air Force Base where the shots will be held.

A Thor missile exploded and was destroyed Thursday in a static firing on a launch pad at Vandenberg, about 170 miles north of here. The Air Force reported there were no casualties.

Carpenter Scale Said 'Not in Line'

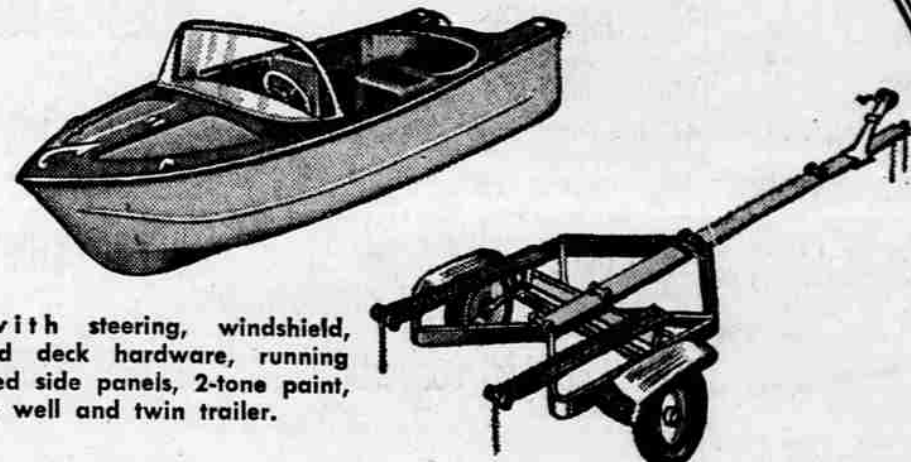
