Advancement in Styling Seen In New Line of Internationals

Advancement in styling, power and pickup body design have been combined with a high degree of truck-to-job model specialization in a new line of International trucks now introduced in the 4,200 to 5,800-pound gross vehicle weight range, J. H. Pollard, manager of International truck sales for the Medford area, 2232 Biddle rd., has announced.

The overall International truck line includes vehicles ranging from 3,800 up to 100,000 pounds GVW.

Designated the B-line, the new light, medium and heavy-duty International trucks are available in four and six-wheel and all-wheel-drive chassis, with six-cylinder or V-8 engines and a wide choice of conventional and compact-design models.

New Bonus-Load

A new "Bonus-Load" pickup body with 25 per cent more cubic capacity also was announced, and new frames that provide greater strength and stability are featured in certain light- and medium-duty models.

"The new Internationals offer an exceedingly broad range of chassis and component options that permit operators to match trucks to their specific jobs with precision and economy," Pollard said.

"New styling will interest truck owners, too, as it combines modern appearance with functional truck design to minimize maintenance and repair costs."

The new B-line styling incorporates chrome-mounted dual headlights and a one-piece anodized aluminum grille which is the largest used on any vehicle. Standard and Custom cabs feature full five-foot wide seats, with custom cabs available in light, medium and heavy-duty conventional models. A wide selection of new two-tone or single color finishes is available.

Optional on light and selected medium-duty models are automatic transmissions, power steering, power brakes and four-wheel drive. Four and six-wheel-drive and tandem-axle drive systems are available on selected medium and heavy-duty chassis.

Nine International six-cylinder valve-in-head truck engines provide a lineup of high-torque standard powerplants. They are offered with horsepower ratings from 113 to 154. Five are gasoline fueled and four are available with factory-installed liquefied-petroleum-gas fuel systems.

Smoothside Pickup

The extra-wide Bonus-Load smoothside pickup body that offers 25 per cent more load area than standard pickups is a significant feature of the B-line, Pollard explained. Contours of the new body match those of the International cabs to create clean, flowing lines

that characterize the vehicle's trim appearance.

Available in seven and eight and one-half foot lengths, Bonus-Load bodies provide capacities of 59.25 and 72.75 cubic feet, respectively.

Patrolman Finds Damsel in Distress

A damsel in distress was at one end of the rope and "an unhappy horse" was at the other end when he arrived at 246 Sunrise ave. Monday evening, Medford Patrolman Keith Van Horn reported.

Van Horn, as he wrote in his report later, "after taking hold of the rope thought the same thing." But, he added, "after several attempts on the horse's part of trying to bite and kick" the mission was accomplished.

669 Attend Chest X-Ray Clinic Here

The chest x-ray clinic at Sacred Heart hospital has been attended by 669 people during the first three months of 1959. Of these, 300 were men, and 369 were women.

A total of 58 people were referred to their physicians for abnormal chest conditions. Twelve of these were suspicious tuberculosis, 16 heart conditions, 14 for further study and 16 miscellaneous conditions. One probable case of lung cancer was found among the 58 cases.

Many doctors in Medford and surrounding area refer patients to the x-ray clinic as part of their physical examinations, according to the Jackson County Tuberculosis and Health association, which sponsors the clinic.

Two groceries have sent employees during the period. The association said it hopes that during the remainder of the year, many other food groups will report for x-rays.

So far in 1959, one active case of tuberculosis has been detected in Jackson county. This was a child found through the tuberculin testing program in the schools.

The chest x-ray clinic is open every Thursday from 2 to 5 p.m. and the first Wednesday each month from 7 to 9 p.m.

Clerical assistance at the clinic is provided by the Providence Guild of Sacred Heart hospital.

Jeep Vehicles Note Highest Sales

Toledo — Retail deliveries and factory sales of "Jeep" vehicles during the first quarter of 1959 were the highest of any first quarter since 1955, C. W. Moss, vice president and general sales manager of Willys Motors, Inc., has announced.

Retail deliveries during the three-month period were 37 per cent ahead of 1958 and factory sales to dealers were up 62 per cent, he reported.

"Jeep" vehicles sales continued a seven-month rise during March, he said, with retail deliveries up 43 per cent and factory sales up 47 per cent from a year ago. March retail sales were greater than any month of the first eight months of 1958, Moss said.

Sales of parts and accessories and of specialized "Jeep" equipment also continued at record levels and were 20.8 per cent over a year ago, he reported.

Anti-Fluoridation Bill Under Attack

Portland — A bill before the Oregon Legislature which seeks to prohibit addition of fluoride to public water supplies has been attacked by the dental health committee of the Oregon State Dental Association.

A statement said that controlled fluoridation "has been proved over and over again to be an inexpensive and completely safe means of preventing up to 65 per cent of dental decay."

The bill was introduced by Rep. Grace Peck of Portland.

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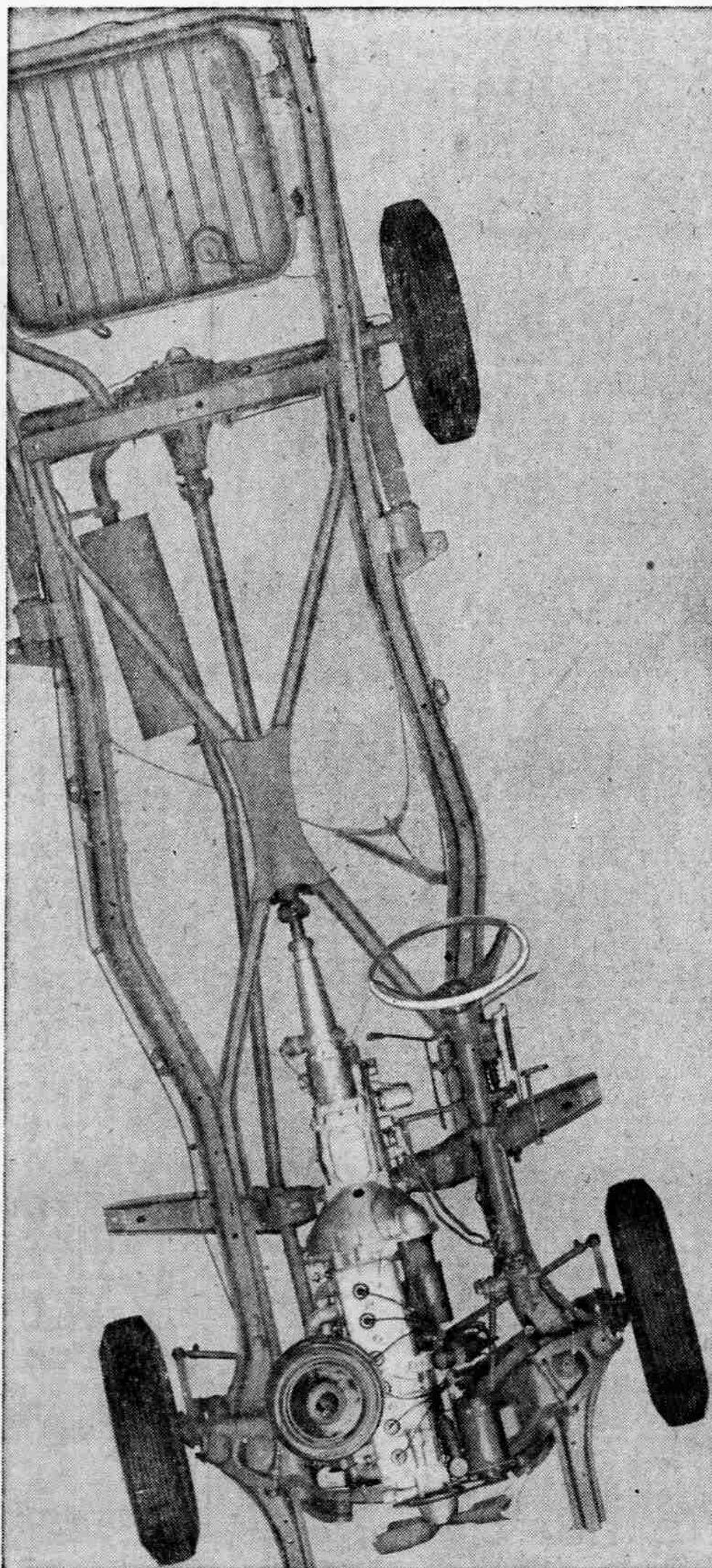

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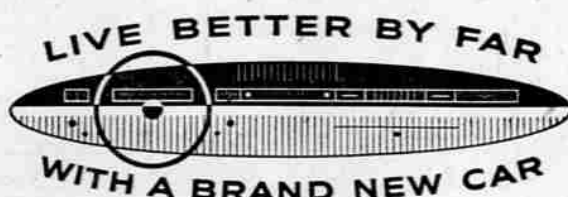
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
