At Least 45 Additional Federal Judges Said Needed at Once

Washington (UPI)—The United States needs a minimum of 45 additional Federal judges at once to break the logjam of court business that is depriving many Americans of their right to swift justice.

That is the considered verdict of the U.S. Judicial Conference, the top policy council of the Federal court system, headed by Chief Justice Earl Warren. It is strongly endorsed by the Justice Department and the American Bar Association.

Yearly Appeal
Each year for the past five years, the Judicial Conference has appealed to Congress to create more Federal judgeships. But Congress has taken no action.

To Attorney General William P. Rogers, this is a "disgraceful" situation.

Rogers says Congress' refusal to authorize more judges cannot be justified on grounds of economy.

Among the 80,000 cases now backed up in the Federal courts, he points out, are many in which the government itself is the defendant. When these cases finally come to trial, the government must pay not only any damages awarded to the plaintiff, but interest on the damages since the date the suit was filed.

"That interest alone runs into millions of dollars a year," says Rogers. "If we could cut down court delay by increasing the number of judges, it would save the government a great deal of money."

Simple Explanation
Republicans have a simple explanation of Congressional inaction on Federal judgeships. They say the Democratic leaders of Congress are unwilling to give a Republican President the opportunity of appointing 45 new judges.

They charge that the Democrats are trying to stall for time until 1961 when they hope that a member of their own party will occupy the White House.

Democratic leaders deny they are motivated by such political considerations. They say the legislation is being held up primarily because the proponents have never documented, to the satisfaction of Congress, the need for 45 additional judges.

Senate Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson, in a letter to Warren Olney II, administrative officer of the U.S. Courts, said he does not believe it is "possible to evaluate the need" for additional judges except on the basis of a detailed survey showing what each existing judicial district has done "to improve the management efficiency of its courts in order to expedite the handling of its cases."

Olney says his office has neither the staff nor the funds to carry out the kind of district-by-district survey that Johnson has demanded.

And there the matter stands.

Charles S. Rhyme, recently retired president of the American Bar Association, says it is "inexcusable" to delay action on the judgeships bill any longer. According to Rhyme, the only real question is whether the 45 judges recommended by the Judicial Conference are "enough to meet the need."

Effort Launched
Under Rhyme's leadership, the Bar Association has launched a nationwide effort to "carry the case to the people" by arousing public opinion to the crisis of congestion now prevailing in the courts.

Attorney General Rogers believes this is the best hope for getting action.

"If the public could be awakened from its apathy," he says, "if people could be made to realize how serious the situation is both to them and to the nation as a whole, I am confident that the steps necessary to overcome delay in the administration of justice in this country would soon be forthcoming."

Strengthened UN Receives Support In Decisions Vote

Corvallis - A strengthened United Nations through which the U.S. can base relations with foreign governments has received strong support from Oregon "Great Decisions" discussion groups.

Opinion ballots from persons participating in informal discussion groups in 22 Oregon counties were tabulated this week by the Oregon State college extension service. Discussion topic was "What Kind of World is Possible?"

Many of those voting favored working toward some form of world government.

Greater mutual understanding between U.S. and foreign peoples and institutions topped factors listed as vital to U.S. national interests in today's world.

Growth of Economy
Continued healthy growth of the U.S. economy, continued access to raw materials and markets of the world, expansion of world trade, faster economic growth in the underdeveloped world and closer economic, political and cultural relations with our industrialized, democratic allies also were rated as important policy considerations.

Military power sufficient to discourage aggression received a third more votes than did military power sufficient to wage any kind of war.

Voters ranked 22 U.S. policy proposals now being debated in Washington, giving top priorities in the following order:

Work for strengthening of the U.N.
Provide the kind of U.S. assistance (where it is wanted) that will help colonial peoples build stable economic, political and social institutions.

Base colonial policy on careful appraisal of each situation.
Expand U.S. assistance to economic growth of underdeveloped world.
Spare no effort toward a workable arms control and inspection system.
