Los Angeles - (UPI) - Charles K. Abboud, 58, a motorist from Omaha, Neb., was lost for seven hours in the labyrinth of the freeway system, he told police Wednesday.

Abboud showed up at police headquarters before dawn to ask for directions. He said he had been trailing the car of his son, Ray, 31, on the San Bernardino Freeway but lost it on a turnoff. Then, said Abboud, a mailman on vacation, he drove back and forth on the freeways, going from one to another, finally finding his way to the police station.

Police located the son who came to police headquarters and drove his father to the home of the son's mother-in-law where they were headed in the first place.

The elder Abboud complained, "Those drivers on the freeway are maniacs. I never encountered anything like it. They never slowed up behind me . . . I just had to keep going . . . They were unmerciful."
