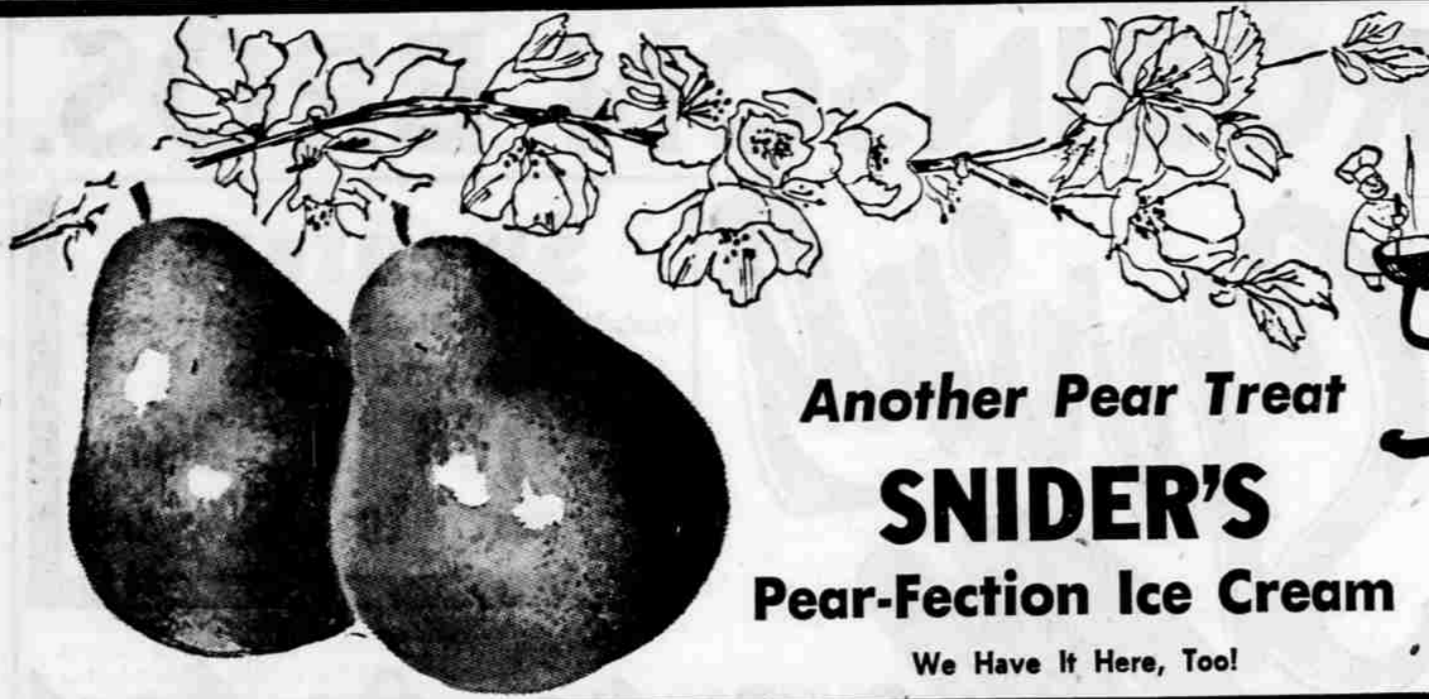

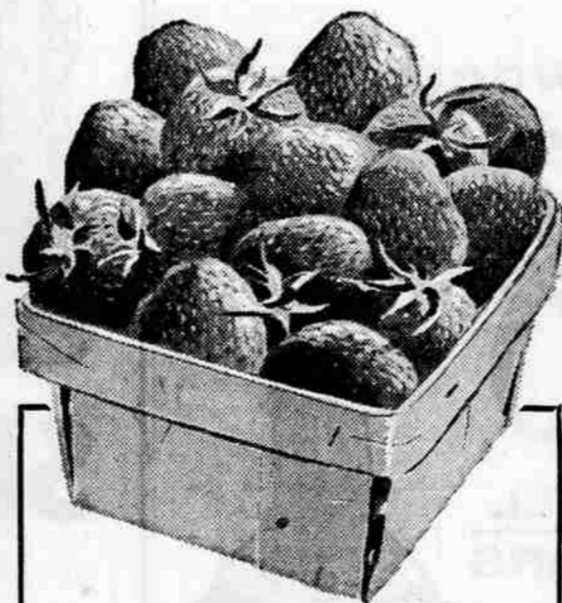

Quotes From the News

Augusta, Ga.—UPI—President Eisenhower, in announcing the resignation of Secretary of State John Foster Dulles: "I personally believe he had filled his office with greater distinction and greater ability than any other man our country has known—a man of tremendous character and courage, intelligence and wisdom."

Indianapolis—Connie Nicholas, when asked if she wished she had never met Forrest Teel, the man she was accused of slaying: "I can't say that. Although if I hadn't, maybe he would be alive and I wouldn't be in the fix I am in."

Laredo, Tex.—UPI—Frank Spreng, the flying bank robber, on being turned over to the FBI by Mexican authorities. "Glad to be back in the United States. I've got a lot of time ahead of me, though. I was trying to catch a boat for Havana."

Redwood City, Calif.—Rose Marie Bjorkland, 18-year-old blonde, quoted by a sheriff after her arrest in the killing of a gardener: "I've had a terrible urge to kill someone ever since I started target shooting."

Washington—Rep. Dale Alford (D-Ark.), on a House committee's decision to investigate his surprise write-in election victory of last November: "It was definitely elected by the majority of the people of the Fifth District of Arkansas in the finest tradition of a democratic election."

British Question Operational Label On Thor Missile

Vandenberg AFB, Calif.—British newsmen today openly questioned the "operational" label the United States has placed on its Thor intermediate range missile. The visiting journalists have been here all week waiting to see the first launching of the 1,500-mile weapon by a Royal Air Force crew, but so far they have waited in vain.

Firings Postponed

The Thor was slated to be blasted over the Pacific missile range both Tuesday and Wednesday but the firings were postponed, once because of bad weather and the second time for unspecified "technical" reasons.

"That giving 'technical' reasons for the delay," said one British newsmen, "means to the British public that the dam thing won't work."

Washington tells us that the Thor is operational," said another, "but our government says it has not yet reached that capability."

However, at least one of the British observers took exception to the views of his colleagues. Rear Adm. Angus Nicholl, Royal Navy (ret.), now military commentator for the British Broadcasting Corp., said "there's nothing wrong with the missile; rather, it requires extremely skilled people to handle such weapons, and that undoubtedly is what is causing some of the delay."

Got To Be Right

The Thor, Nicholl conceded, "is very expensive and they've got to be quite sure they're right before any firing... with inexperienced personnel (such as the British

launch crews) there still is some difficulty in interpreting the complicated instruments. It's the training that they are here for, and technical delays are quite possible rather than weather delays."

"It isn't fair to say the Thor is not operational, but the newsman's reaction is that of a critic," Nicholl said. "He gets into the habit of being cynical about official statements."

The American-made Thor missile already lines British bases as a deterrent weapon against Russia. British troops have been brought here to be trained in its use and the present firing caps their graduation exercises.

Log Truck Weight Mile Tax Favored

Salem—UPI—The Joint Ways and Means Committee Wednesday recommended passage of House bill 29 which would eliminate the flat fee option for logging trucks and place such trucks under the weight mile tax law.

Sen. Francis Ziegler (R-Corvallis) opposed the bill saying that it would result in injury to the small logging operators. However, Rep. Verne Cady (D-Burns) said the logging truck operators favored elimination of the option.

Cady said small operators had found now that it was more economical to be under the weight mile law.

Portland Woman Freed From Prison

Portland—UPI—Mrs. Helen Davenport, 87, Portland club woman, was freed Wednesday after serving about one month of a one-year prison sentence for conspiracy to use the mails to defraud. Federal Judge Gus J. Solomon said he ordered her freed after a doctor's report that she is suffering from a severe heart ailment. She was convicted in connection with financing of the Mt. Hood Hardboard and Plywood Cooperative by sale of membership certificates in the concern.
