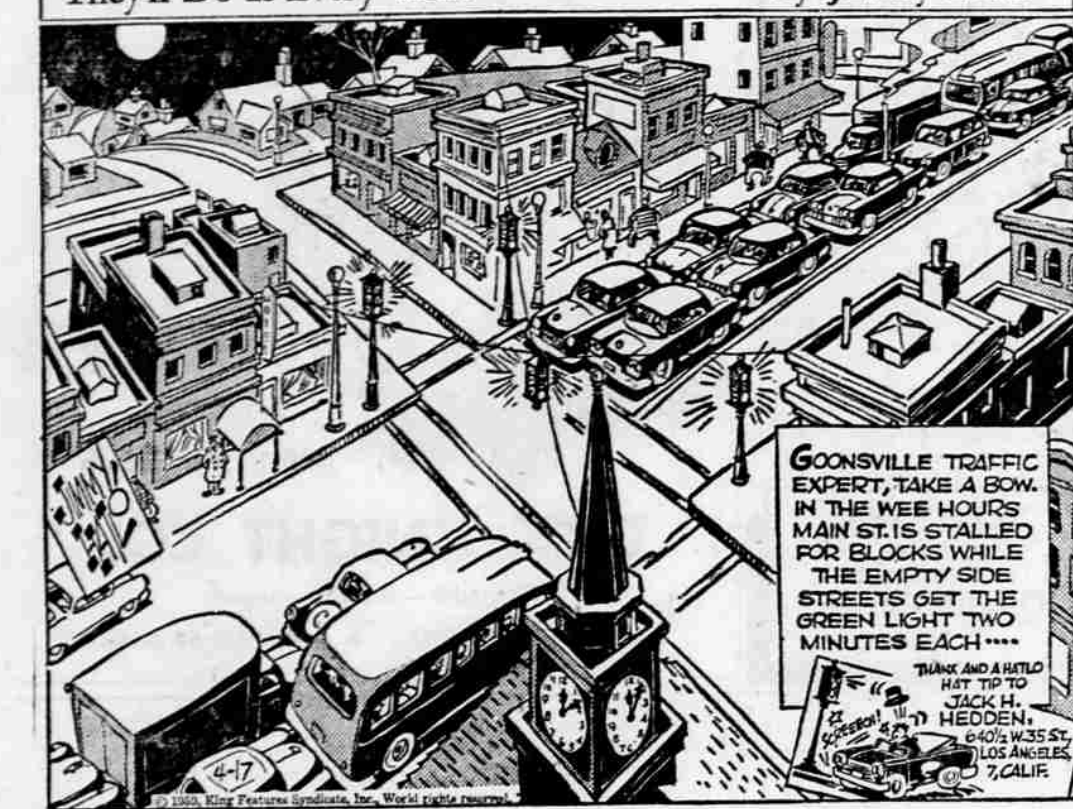

Hundreds of us, when we sit down to pour out our problems to a President, address our letters to him in red, white and blue. In fact, letters bearing only a crude crayon drawing of the American flag have been known to end up at the White House.

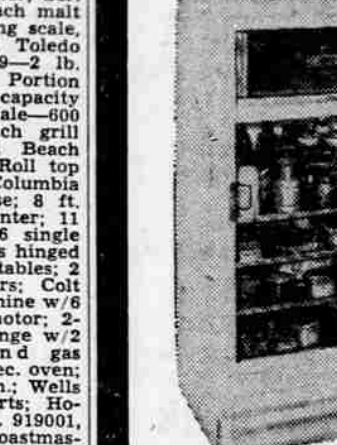
