Woman Attorney to Speak For League Annual Session

Guest speaker for the annual meeting of the Medford League of Women Voters Saturday, March 25, at the Red Cross building will be Miss Noreen Kelly, local attorney. Luncheon will be served at 12:30 p.m.

Miss Kelly will discuss the organization of the court system from the smallest to the largest unit, as a tie-in with the League's study item for May, which is to be the administration of justice in Jackson county.

Listed in Who's Who of American Women, the young attorney served as Medford

municipal judge in 1957-58. She is a graduate from St. Mary's school in 1949; attended Maryhurst college in Portland for three years; and received her bachelor of science and bachelor of law degrees from the University of Oregon.

From July to December, 1955, Miss Kelly toured countries in Europe. She has practiced law in Medford since December, 1955, when she became a partner of her father in the firm established by her grandfather in 1906.

At the present time she shares the partnership with

her brother, Bernard, while her father, Edward C. Kelly, serves as circuit court judge. She is a member of the Oregon Bar association and the American Bar association and has been admitted to practice in federal court.

For one year during her college career, Miss Kelly served as state president of the Young Democrats and is also a member of Pi Beta Phi social sorority.

She will be introduced by Mrs. Ben Day, resource chairman for the justice section of the League's "Know Your County" study.
