The Indians piled up their biggest score of the season on Tuesday night when they crushed the Detroit Tigers, 14-1, and retained a two-game grip on first place in the American league. Minnie Minoso paced the 16-hit assault by driving in six runs with two homers and three singles and Cal McLish pitched a steady six-hitter.

The California Supreme Court, in a second ruling on suits to block transfer of 300 acres of land in Chavez Ravine to the Dodgers, held that the city did not violate public purpose restrictions in its deeds to the land it negotiated to transfer to the baseball club.

West Coast fans got a sample of what Giant-Dodger games can be like Tuesday night when the teams staged a three-hour and 47-minute struggle eventually won by the Dodgers, 9-7, in 11 innings. It was a battle of homers—with Don Demeter hammering out three two-run round-trippers including the game-winning shot in the 11th inning.

Dodger president Walter F. O'Malley immediately expressed the hope that with "hustle" the club could get started on the 55,000-seat stadium in time to have it ready for opening day next year.

The traditional rivalry that wrote some of the greatest stories in the annals of major league baseball moved from New York to California last year but turned out to be pretty much of a bust as the Giants piled up a 16-game edge over the Dodgers.
