Salem—UPI—The Senate has passed and sent to the House a bill establishing a Bureau of Criminal Investigation and Identification in the state police.

A similar bill passed by the Legislature in 1957 was vetoed by ex-Gov. Robert D. Holmes.

The bill provides that the state police department must maintain a file of all apprehended criminals including fingerprints, photographs, personal history and descriptions and make available these materials to all government agencies requesting it.

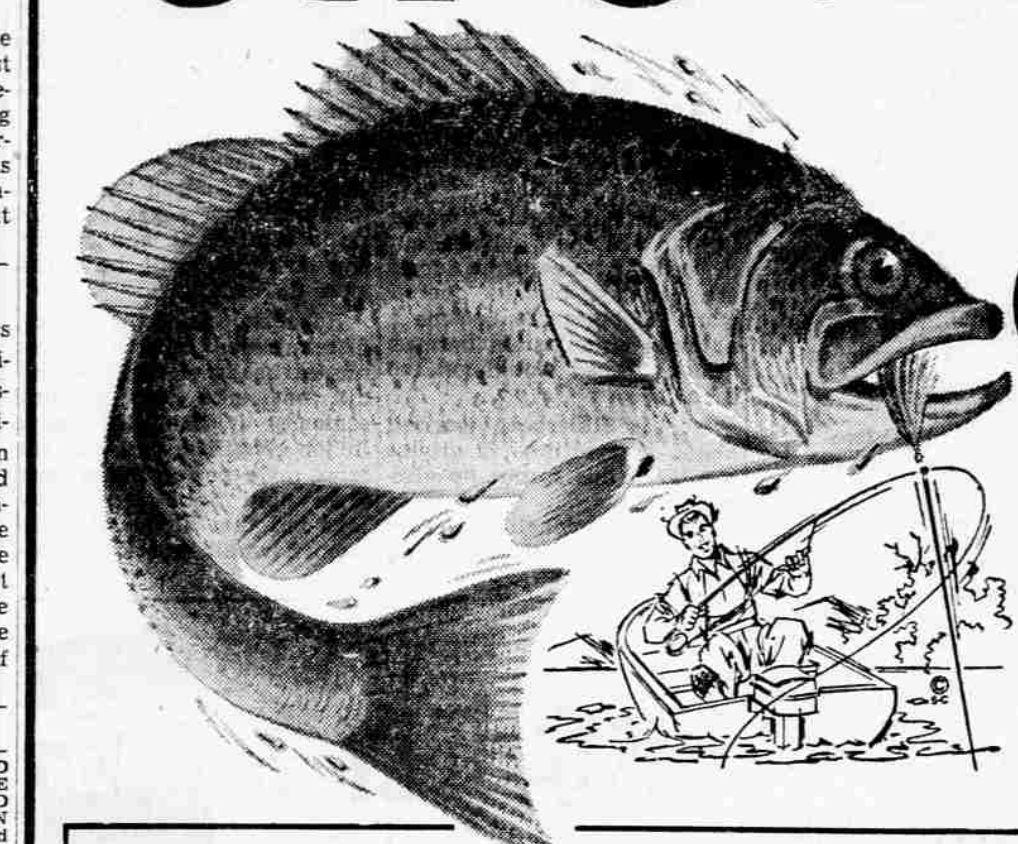
