

BUTTE FALLS Angler's Breakfast Set

The April issue of the Butte Falls Lions club will hold a "fisherman's breakfast" Saturday and Sunday, April 25 and 26, at the city park, weather permitting.

This program will not only give the students a better understanding of reforestation, but as the years go by the students will see their work grow in the form of living timber. A sack lunch was eaten by members of the group at the Whiskey springs camp ground.

ORDINANCE NO. 7206
AN ORDINANCE providing for the construction of a sanitary sewer in Springbrook Road from approximately 600 feet South of West Roberts Road to 800 feet North of Buckshot Hill Road in the City of Medford, Oregon, and for the assessment of the cost thereof on adjacent property providing for a meeting of the Council to consider protests against said improvement and providing for the serving of the owners of adjacent property with notice thereof by the Recorder.

CITY OF MEDFORD DOH ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
Section 1. That it is the intention of the Council to cause the construction of a sanitary sewer in Springbrook Road from approximately 600 feet South of West Roberts Road to 800 feet North of Buckshot Hill Road in accordance with the hereby adopted and identified plans and specifications on file in the office of the City Manager, at the City Hall, Medford, Oregon, to which plans and specifications reference is hereby made for details and estimated costs thereof, and to assess upon each lot, or part thereof, adjacent to and benefited by such improvement its proportionate share of the cost of said improvement as provided by the Charter of the City of Medford.

Section 2. The Council will meet in the Council Chambers at the City Hall on the 7th day of May, 1959, at 7:30 o'clock P.M., at which time and place the owners of said adjacent property are hereby called upon to appear before said Council and show cause, if any, why said improvement should not be constructed, and why said property should not be assessed for the construction thereof.

Section 3. That warrants for the costs of the aforementioned improvement shall bear interest at four per cent (4%) per annum and shall constitute general obligations of the City of Medford, and said warrants shall be issued pursuant to, and on the terms and conditions set forth in, Oregon Revised Statutes 287.502 to 287.510, inclusive.

Section 4. The City Recorder is hereby directed to serve notice hereof upon the property owners aforesaid, by publishing this Ordinance once in a daily newspaper, printed, published and of general circulation in said City at least ten (10) days before the date of said meeting, and by posting five copies of this Ordinance in five public and conspicuous places in said City for a period of ten (10) days prior to said meeting.

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Dr. Haines Writes For Encyclopedia

Ashland — Medford, its early history, resources and other vital statistics, is the subject of an article by Dr. Frank D. Haines Jr., assistant professor of social science at Southern Oregon college, which will appear in the revised edition of the Encyclopedia Britannica.

Specializing in Northwest history, Dr. Haines has been instrumental in uncovering a number of early-day documents and other materials dealing with happenings in this part of the state which have been of particular interest during the Oregon Centennial Year.

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Post-Conviction Relief Put Under Clearer Statute

Salem (UPI)—A bill putting all the various methods of obtaining post-conviction relief under a clearer statute has passed the Oregon House and has been sent to the Senate.

Convicts at Oregon state prison had considerable interest in the bill.

Rep. George Van Hoomissen (D-Portland) said the bill put Oregon law in line with a recent U. S. Supreme Court decision in an Illinois case.

The Illinois Supreme Court had denied a convicted robber of rights to a transcript of his court trial after he stated that he did not have money to pay for it.

The decision was on technical grounds, but the U. S. Supreme Court said it denied the imprisoned man equal protection of the laws.

"This bill will provide a uniform procedure for all post-conviction measures assuring equal protection of the laws," Van Hoomissen said.

A resolution referring to the people the issue of whether the state superintendent of public instruction should be appointive rather than elective was passed.
