The mandrake plant was grown from seeds sent to Mrs. Holst by the curator at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Israel, and is seldom seen in the United States. The dittany plant seldom produces seeds and as it dies quickly must be propagated by planting slips.

Mrs. Frank Carson will make the dried herb seed pod arrangement and explain it, as well as the fresh herb centerpiece for the tea table.
