## Luce Controversy Promises Tougher Time for Nominees

Washington—UPI—Congressional foreign policy leaders said today the disputed assignment of Clare Booth Luce as ambassador to Brazil forecast a tighter Senate check on future non-career diplomats—starting with Ogden R. Reid of New York.

Reid, the former editor of the New York Herald-Tribune, 33 years old and lacking Mrs.

Luce's diplomatic experience, is President Eisenhower's nominee as ambassador to Israel—a hot spot in the Middle East.

A key member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, preferring not to be identified, said Reid and all other non-career nominees will get "very, very close scrutiny" as a result of the Luce affair.

The severity of the Luce confirmation battle made it a certainty that Reid would face tough going.

President Eisenhower gave Mrs. Luce, former envoy to Italy, warm support for the Brazilian post despite a continuing storm of Senate criticism of her behavior under fire. The Senate confirmed her nomination Tuesday, but a post-confirmation statement she issued slapping at Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) reopened the controversy.

The dispute flared anew late Wednesday with these developments:—Senate GOP leader Everett

M. Dirksen (Ill.) accused Morse of trying to persuade Mrs. Luce's physician to violate his Hippocratic Oath by giving Morse a report on her "psychiatric" condition without her permission. Morse said she had been getting psychiatric treatment and had never asked for a medical report. Her doctor said she had not.

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## Bury Differences, Governor Asks

Salem—UPI—Gov. Mark Hatfield Wednesday called upon members of the House and Senate Tax Committees to bury their differences and get together on a tax program.

"The people of this state are now suffering from the continued fighting between the Senate and House Taxation Committees," he said.

"I call upon them once again, as I did a month ago, to meet in joint sessions, bury their personal differences that divide the Democratic majority leadership at this session, and work for the mutual

good of all Oregonians." The House-approved tax program was completely revised by the Senate Tax Committee.

Hatfield declined to express a preference for either program. He said neither includes the features of "base-broadening" and "flexibility" of his program.

## Truman Called By Committee

Washington—UPI—Former President Truman was invited today to appear before the House Committee on Un-American Activities and "explain fully" his remarks at Columbia University that the committee "is the most un-American thing in the country today."

Truman, in his final salty lecture session at Columbia University Wednesday also had told students that "witch hunters in the House and Senate are charging things that do not exist."

Rep. Francis E. Walter (D-Pa.) chairman of the committee, sent a telegram today to Truman at his New York hotel saying:

"Respectfully request that you explain fully by giving bill of particulars what is un-American in the jurisdiction, composition and conduct of the House Committee on Un-American Activities."

Walter added "your appearance before the committee for that purpose will be most welcome."

## Another Condemned In Duncan Slaying

Ventura, Calif.—UPI—Luis Moya, 22, Wednesday night became the third person condemned to die in the gas chamber for the "for hire" slaying of attractive Olga Duncan, 30-year-old Canadian-born nurse.

A jury of five women and seven men deliberated 5 hours and 15 minutes before returning the death verdict in the 10-day sentencing hearing.

Moya, an ex-convict with a criminal record dating back to his childhood, showed no trace of emotion when the verdict was pronounced.

Moya pleaded guilty earlier to joining with Augustine Baldonado, 25, to kill Olga last Nov. 17 for an offer of \$8,000 by the victim's mother-in-law, Mrs. Elizabeth Duncan, 55, of Santa Barbara, Calif.

O'Leary fills a position which was vacated last Dec. 1 when Al Hansen transferred to Anchorage, Alaska. His wife, Joy E. (Trumbull) O'Leary, is a graduate of the University of Oregon. She and their son, Robert Dennis, 3½, expect to move to Medford in the near future.
