 Rivers in northwestern Washington were slowly receding today easing a flood threat which had hovered over the region for the past several days. Swollen streams overflowed their banks, inundating roads and farmlands and forcing the evacuation of several families Thursday. However, the rivers began their slow drop during the night and favorable weather helped the situation. An Indian village at Mari-

etta was evacuated Thursday when high tides and the swollen Nooksack river combined to inundate the area. No rain was reported today in any of the affected areas.
