Move By Dykes Proves To Be Genius Stroke

Detroit — (UPI) — Jimmie Dykes' first move as Detroit Tiger manager was a stroke of genius—he rescued Charlie Maxwell from the bench and Maxwell rescued the Tigers with four Herculean home runs.

Maxwell's record-tying homers, plus the pitching of Yankee-killer Frank Lary and Don Mossi, combined to shoot Dykes off to a blazing start Sunday with 4-2 and 8-3 victories over the world champion New York Yankees.

Maxwell balked at a pay cut last winter and was frequently mentioned in trade rumors. Then Detroit got Larry Doby in spring training. Doby beat the fans' favorite, Maxwell, out of the starting left field job and Maxwell's spirits sank lower.

He perked up when he hit a three-run pinch homer on opening day and drove in two more runs as a pinch hitter the next day but when he was restored to left field he could not buy hit and Bill Norman benched him. His start Sunday was his first in 10 days.

Maxwell's smashes — his first since the one opening day-tied a major league record and American league record. The major league mark was four home runs in consecutive at-bats and the AL mark was for four homers in a double-header.

Records Busted As Ducks Win
Pullman, Wash. — (UPI) — Four meet records and one all-time Washington State College school mark went by the boards here Saturday as Oregon downed Washington State 74-57 in a Northern Division dual meet.

Dick Rubens of WSC set the new dual meet record with a throw of 227 feet 10 inches in the javelin.

Oregon men set two marks — in the pole vault and discus. Jack Burg vaulted 14 feet three inches to break the meet record of 14 feet set by George Rasmussen of Oregon in 1950. Gene Estes, duck discus ace, threw 160 feet 2 1/2 inches to erase the record of 153 feet eight inches set by Steve Frye, WSC, last year. Frye won the shot however, and broke his own record in the event with a heave of 54 feet 9 3/4 inches.

Vancouver, B.C. — (UPI) — Bill Dellinger, former Oregon distance runner, broke two records in the annual Vancouver Relays Saturday. He won the mile in 4:10.5 and the three mile in 14:16.6.

Martin Pedigo, another former Oregon ace, jumped 23 feet 4 1/4 inches to break the broad jump mark.

Gary Stenlund, Oregon State freshman, threw the javelin 228 feet 2 inches to finish behind John Fromm, Seattle, who set a new meet mark of 236 feet 9 inches. OSC won the team mile with 89 points. Eastern Washington was next with 54.

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Morse Denies Personal Feud

South Orange, N.J. — (UPI) — Sen. Wayne L. Morse (D-Ore.) says he did not oppose the nomination of Mrs. Clare Boothe Luce as ambassador to Brazil because of a "personal vendetta."

Morse said Sunday that it was he who moved last month in the Senate Foreign Relations committee that Mrs. Luce's nomination be approved. The senator said he changed his mind late as the result of an investigation of Mrs. Luce.

Morse undertook the investigation because of complaints about her following recent riots in Bolivia, the senator declared at a membership meeting of the Young Men's Hebrew Association at Congregation Beth-El.

The riots were caused by publication of a story on Bolivia in Time Magazine. Time is published by Henry Luce, Mrs. Luce's husband.

Morse also defended his call to Mrs. Luce's physician inquiring about her emotional state. He said he made the call only after someone told him the doctor was willing to talk about his famous patient.
