Emergency Relief Slated for Haiti

Washington - UPI - Catholic Relief Services announced today it will undertake an emergency relief program for famine victims in Haiti.

A long drought has led to "many cases of starvation among both children and adults" in the northwest section of the Caribbean country, the agency said.

To get the emergency program underway, Catholic Relief Services diverted to Haiti 300 tons of food intended for shipment to another area of the world. It planned to ship 130 tons of surplus food to Haiti each week. Medicines also be sent.

Contract Awarded For Pump House

A \$28,578 contract for construction of two pumping stations in the Berrydale sanitary sewer project was awarded to Den Herder Construction company, Lebanon, by the Medford city council last night.

Bids on the project were opened April 13. The council subsequently awarded the contract for the sewer system to Jeske Brothers Construction company, Eugene.

An exchange of land to provide a site for the principal pumping station, which will pump sewage from the Berrydale system to the Camp White trunk line, was also authorized. By this exchange, the council acquires a lot from R. W. Strawn in exchange for a lot purchased recently from John R. and Harriet Creel.

The council gave retroactive approval to the city's replacement of sections of a sanitary sewer line along East Jackson st. between Bear creek and Genesee st. City Manager Robert A. Duff said the work was undertaken "on our own initiative" before the widening and paving of that stretch of Jackson st. by a private contractor began. Duff said the sewer replacement work was "practically complete."

Also approved was establishment of two two-hour parking zones in front of the Harry B. Marshall office building at 246 East 10th st.
