

Man Pleads Guilty To Court Charges

James R. Jackson of Medford and Portland, pleaded guilty in district court Wednesday afternoon to a charge of making a false statement in writing to procure benefit.

Jackson, who was returned to Medford from Portland by sheriff's deputies earlier this year, had originally been arraigned in circuit court Feb. 27 on a charge of uttering and publishing a false check.

The felony charge was dismissed on a motion of the district attorney, Jackson was charged with cashing a \$75 check July 21, 1958, in a Medford store.

Judge Roy Bashaw sentenced him to nine months in the county jail on the recommendation that he be transferred to Multnomah county.

Most Men are Mixtures Of Good and Bad

While re-reading Charles Darwin's Autobiography (Harcourt, Brace, N.Y.), I was impressed with what Darwin said about Captain Fitzroy of the Beagle. During the five-year voyage, Darwin shared a cabin with him. As he wrote, "His character had many noble features. He was devoted to his duty, generous to a fault, bold, determined, indomitably energetic, and an ardent friend to all under his sway." But he was so suspicious, hot-tempered, and violent; so unreasonable, and at times insane, that he was a hard man to live near.

After the voyage, Darwin avoided him because he was so easily offended for no reason. Eventually, like his uncle, Fitzroy committed suicide. As Darwin said, it was remarkable that a man who could be so noble could, at the same time, be so unreasonable. A Child Who Bangs His Head

People write asking me what to do for a small child who keeps banging his head against the side of his crib, or who gets up on his hands and knees and then keeps throwing his body back heavily on his heels. I have asked some of the best children's specialists in the world about such behavior and they tell me they don't know what it is due to. All they know is that the child eventually gets over it. So far as I can learn, it doesn't leave any permanent result. I know a handsome big and able lad in college who, in his babyhood, used to swing back and forth, half-asleep in his crib. Another child I knew who for months banged his head each night is today a powerfully built and fine high school student.

Gray Hair

Many persons ask why they should have gotten gray early. In such cases I always have the blood checked and the gastric juice examined to see if there is any sign of pernicious anemia. Quite a few persons who inherit anemia have a tendency to get gray early. They can be helped by taking an injection of Vitamin B12 once a month.

I know of no vitamin, or anything, that will keep the hair from getting gray or that will change its color after it is gray. Women whose hair keeps falling out should have their basal metabolic rate checked.
