159 Building Permits Issued During April

A total of 159 building permits for projects with a total value of \$322,902 were issued at Medford city hall during April, according to building department records.

The total represented a decrease from March's respective totals of 186 and \$828,387. In April, 1958, 78 permits with a total valuation of \$1,012,514 were issued, records show.

Among major projects last month were erection of 13 new single-family dwellings at a total value of \$152,800, remodeling of a duplex at \$8,000 and remodeling or repairing of 11 business establishments at \$38,150.

Remodeling Permits
A total of 19 permits with a total valuation of \$52,950 were issued for remodeling or repairing single-family dwellings.

Two permits were issued to the city of Medford, one at \$2,500 for remodeling the top floor of city hall and the other at \$6,889 for a water pumping station on Barneburg hill.

Plumbing permits last month, primarily for sewer lines in connection with the Kenwood-Grandview sanitary sewer project, totaled 49.

The total revenue from fees received last month was \$5,955.08. This included a \$4,500 advance fee from Rogue Valley Manor, according to a department spokesman.

A total of 1,243 inspections were reported last month by department inspectors, compared to 1,145 in March.
