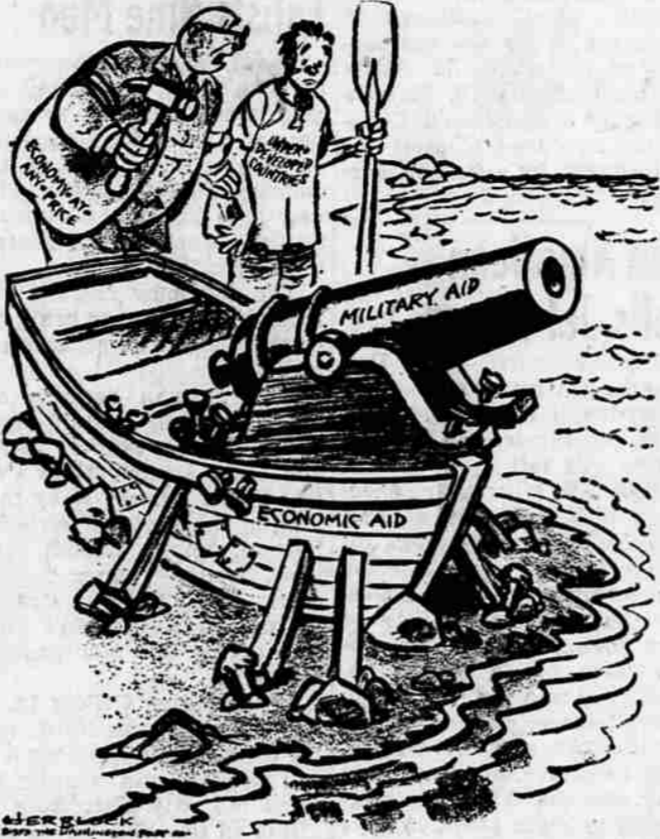
Weather Delays Search For Mats
