YREKA Auto Accidents Reported

Yreka - The California highway patrol reports that two persons were killed and 12 others injured in accidents on Siskiyou county highways last week.

One head-on collision three miles north of Grass Lake, was responsible for the death of eight-month-old Fern Peterson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Peterson, San Pablo, Calif. Receiving injuries were Peterson, his wife and four children, and two passengers of the second car driven by Carl Williams Jr., 16.

Earl Jesse Spears Rio Linda, Calif., was killed in an accident four miles north of Big Springs rd. a week ago Saturday when he was pinned beneath his auto after failing to negotiate a turn. A passenger, Earl Hall, Geneva, Ohio, was injured.

Fred Roberson, 20, Yreka, received minor injuries and was treated at Siskiyou County General hospital when the car in which he was a passenger over-turned on a curve on Greenview rd. Sunday. Driver of the Car, Dr. Carl V. Reichman, 22, Vallejo, was uninjured.

The Carl Scarrow family returned home from the Etna rodeo Sunday, May 3, to find their home burned to the ground, including all their household belongings and the family jeep. The house was located on a mining claim on Greenhorn creek.

California division of forestry and Klamath National forest fire crews from Fort Jones answered the call but arrived too late to save the structure.
