

### Hayden Assured Panama Passage

Los Angeles — (AP) — The former wife of actor Sterling Hayden has stipulated in court she will not interfere if Hayden sails his schooner through the Panama Canal on his court-defying cruise with their four children.

"Nothing could be more dangerous than a passage around the Cape Horn in any season," Mrs. Betty De Noon Hayden said.

She indicated Wednesday she had information that Hayden would travel around Cape Horn if she failed to give her permission for passage through the canal without any hindrance.

Hayden took his four children, aged 6 to 10, aboard his 98-foot schooner Wanderer last January and sailed to the South Seas despite a court order forbidding him to take them along on the year-long film-making voyage.

### Jonathan Winters Committed To Mental Hospital

San Francisco — (AP) — Moon-faced comedian Jonathan Winters, 32, was committed by his wife Wednesday night to a private mental hospital.

The humorist was taken to the institution near here on the advice of psychiatrists, who found him "quite disturbed" and in need of "long-term" mental care.

Winters, master of a multitude of voice characterizations and comic facial expressions, had been showing signs of strain and recently joined Alcoholics Anonymous.

Winters was taken into custody for strange antics on San Francisco's waterfront. Psychiatrists recommended Wednesday that he be committed to a private institution for "rest and quiet."

Dr. T. E. Albers, superintendent of San Francisco General hospital said the comedian was "quite disturbed" and needed "long-term" mental care.

Winters' wife, Eileen, arrived here Wednesday from the couple's home in Mamaroneck, N.Y. She spent the afternoon with her husband in his isolation room in the hospital's psychiatric section.

Plans To Comply  
Mrs. Winters said she would make immediate arrangements to comply with the recommendations of the psychiatrists.

"He's just tired out," she said. "He'll be all right soon."

Winters was taken into custody Tuesday on the gangplank of the square-rigged sailing ship Balclutha, tied up at the San Francisco Embarcadero on public display.

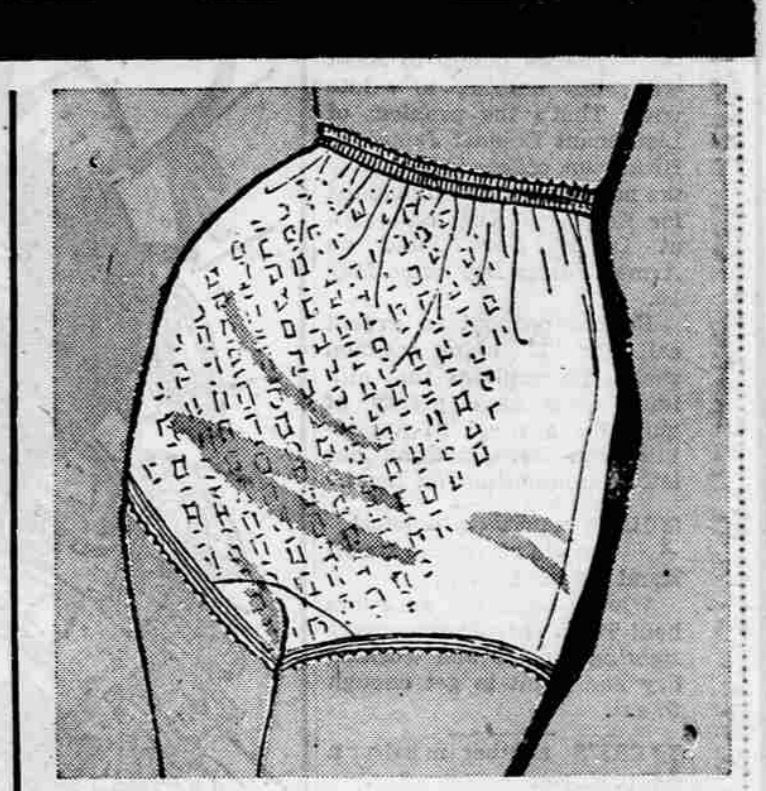

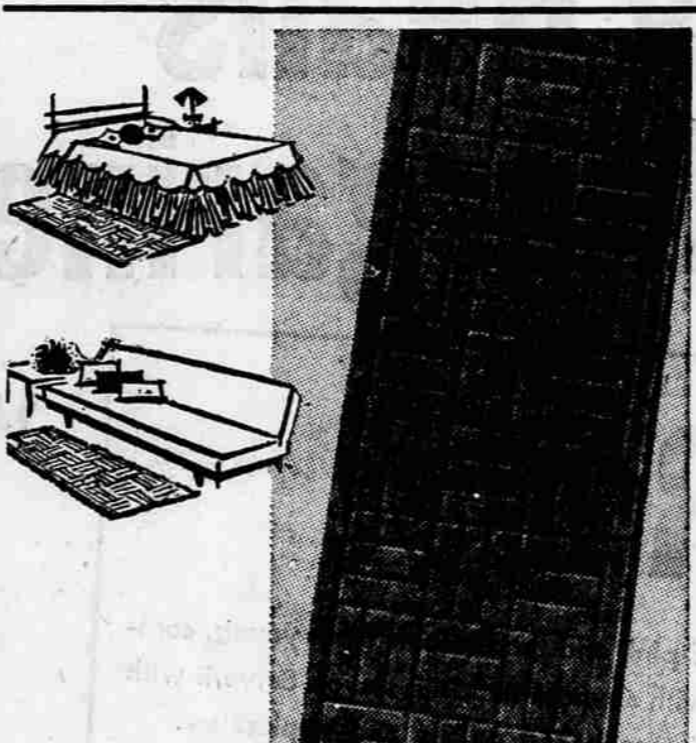

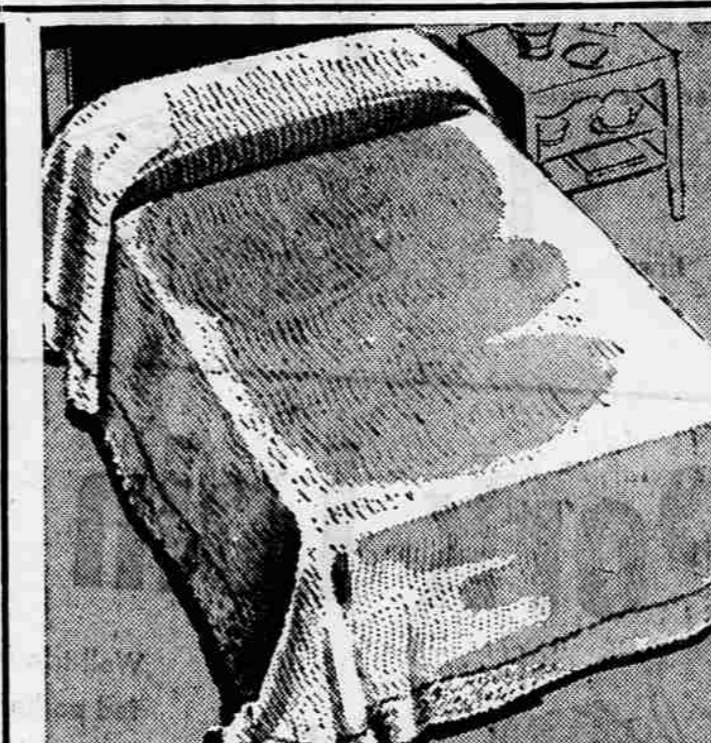
