

Wall Street Chatter

New York - (UPI) - The immediate stock market outlook remains constructive, aided by a combination of favorable technical and business factors, says Van Alstyne, Noel & Co. Kelsey-Hayes is expected to show about \$4.50 a share for the year to end in August against \$2.47 in the previous fiscal year, according to W. E. Hutton & Co.

Welton & Co. notes that some sources think Chrysler might earn between \$3 and \$4 a share for the second quarter against \$1.75 in the first.

Shearson, Hammill & Co. estimates that net income for the 12 trunk line air transports will in 1959 top the previous peak of \$63 million established in 1955.

Montana-Dakota Utilities

may earn nearly \$2 a share in 1959 against \$1.65 in 1958, reflecting an increase in oil royalty payments from owned properties in the Walliston basin to approximately 45 cents a share annually, says E. F. Hutton & Co.

Richfield Oil is expected to set a new sales record in 1959 and report a substantial recovery from the \$5.02 a share of 1958, says Dean Witter & Co.

Northern Pacific Railway 1959 earnings should be around \$4 to \$4.25 a share, against \$3.68 in 1958, Abraham & Co. estimates.

Twining Given Recovery Chance

Washington - (UPI) - Gen. Nathan F. Twining, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, was given a good chance today to recover from lung cancer.

The 61-year-old general, who underwent surgery Tuesday at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, was expected to leave the hospital in three or four weeks and return to his defense post a few weeks after that.

The Defense Department announced Thursday that a cancerous tumor had been found on a portion of Twining's left lung removed by surgeons. It said there was no evidence of cancer in other areas of the chest.

"This is a single area," said Brig. Gen. James H. Forsee, chief surgeon at Walter Reed. "It has all been removed and we think his prognosis (outlook for recovery) is a good one considering the fact that this is cancer."

State Education Supervisor Quits

Salem - (UPI) - The second supervisor of secondary education to announce his resignation from the State Education Department this week is Dr. Clyde Martin, Salem.

He said Thursday he has accepted a position as director of curriculum in Union High school district No. 5, Milwaukie, starting July 1.

Earlier, Clifford Moffitt, Salem, was named principal of South Eugene High school. The department ordinarily has four supervisors of secondary education. It now has only one, Dale Skewis, John S. Conway, formerly a supervisor, is now director of secondary education.

The cowboy said he never dated Miss Conner, and denied that he had ever given her money for the child's support.

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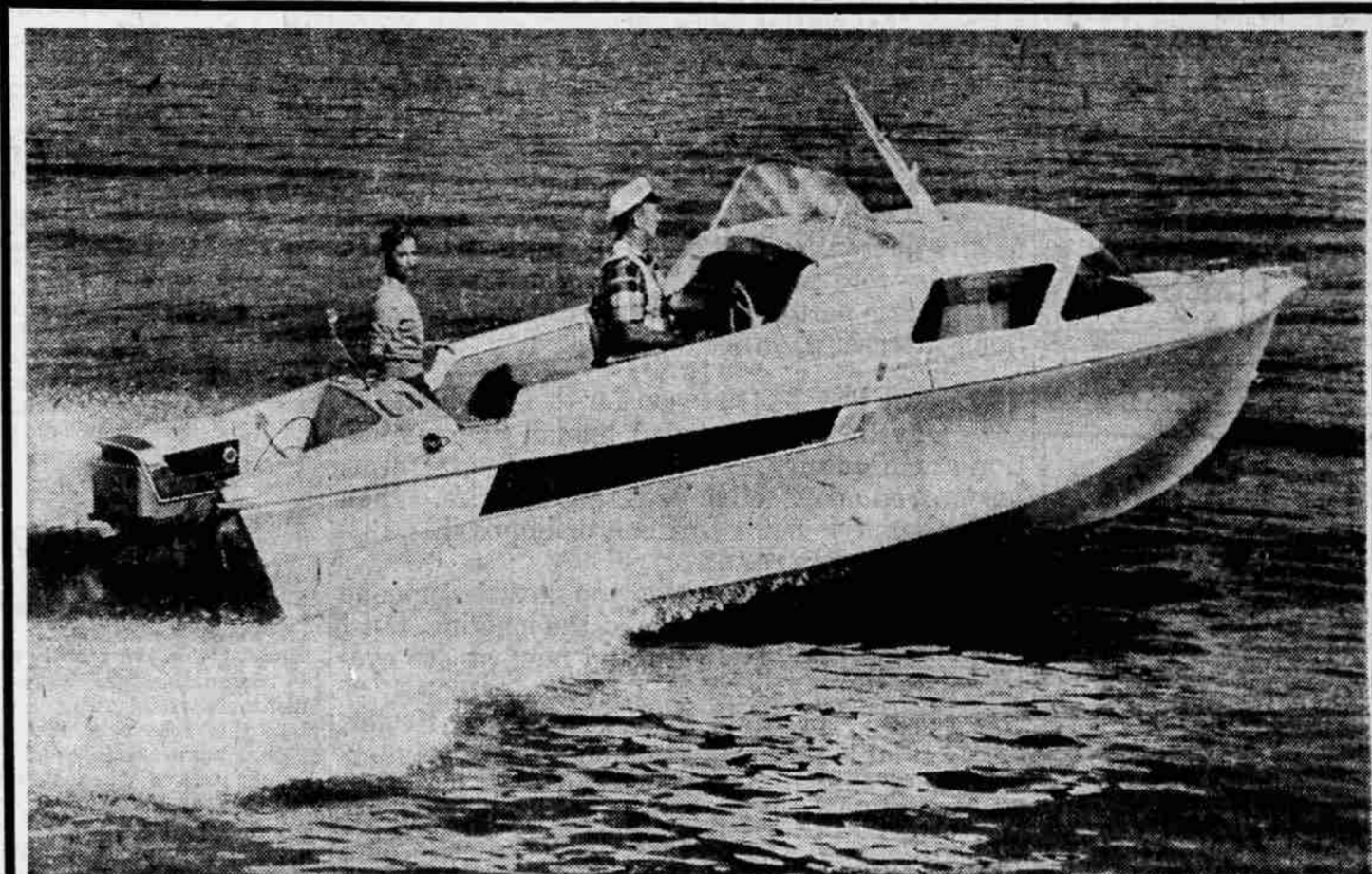
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
