The tea will replace this month's regular business meeting and the next session is scheduled for Monday, June 15.

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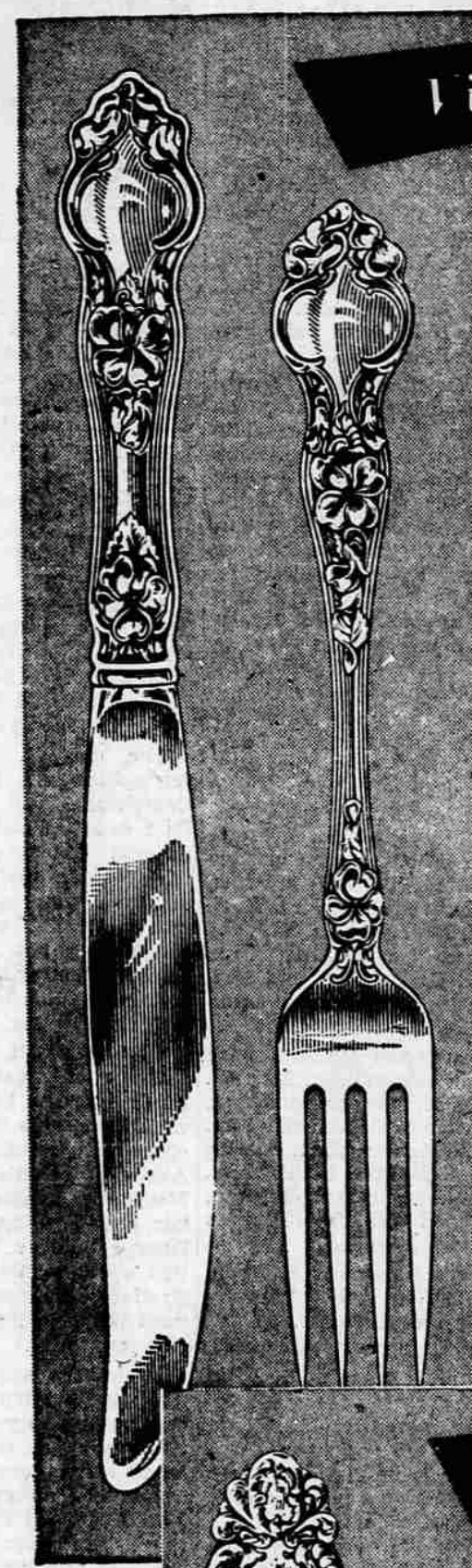
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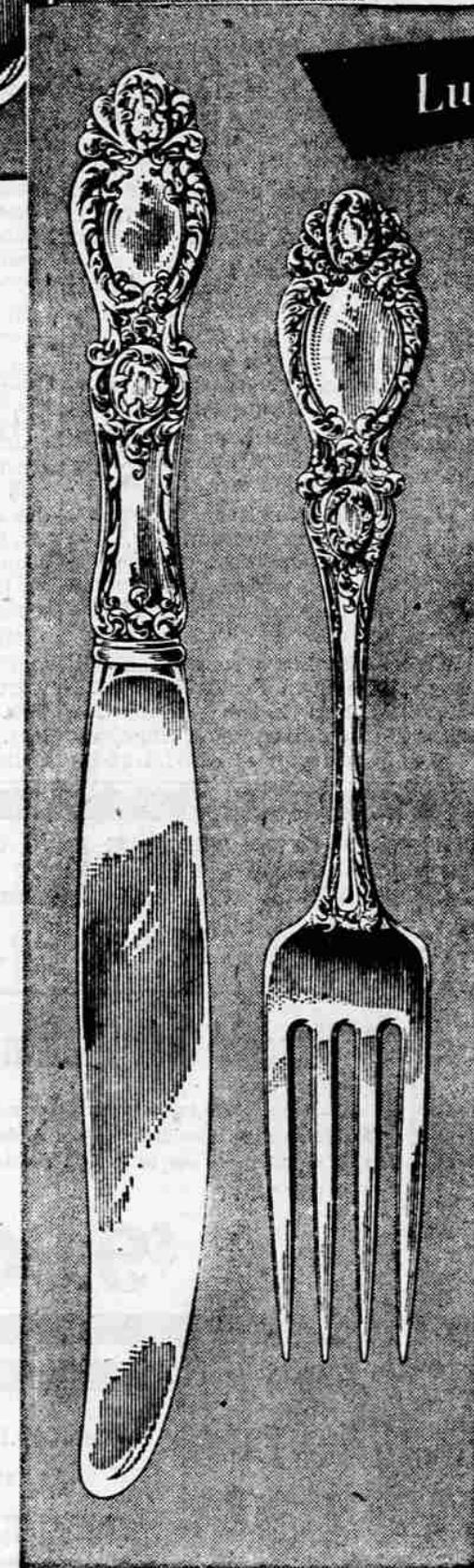
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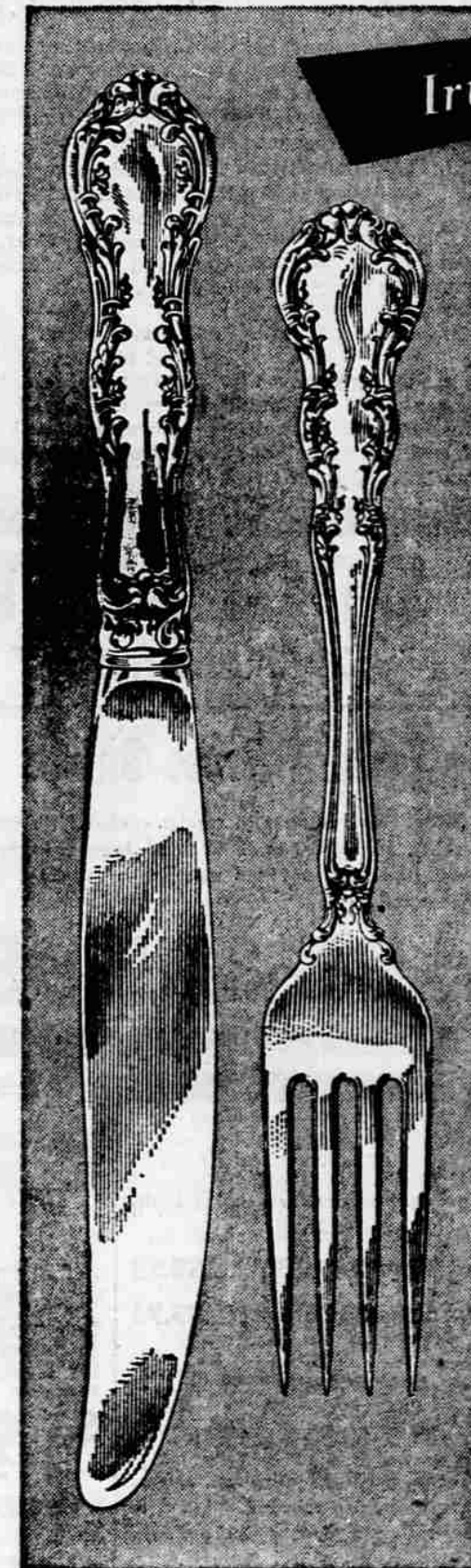
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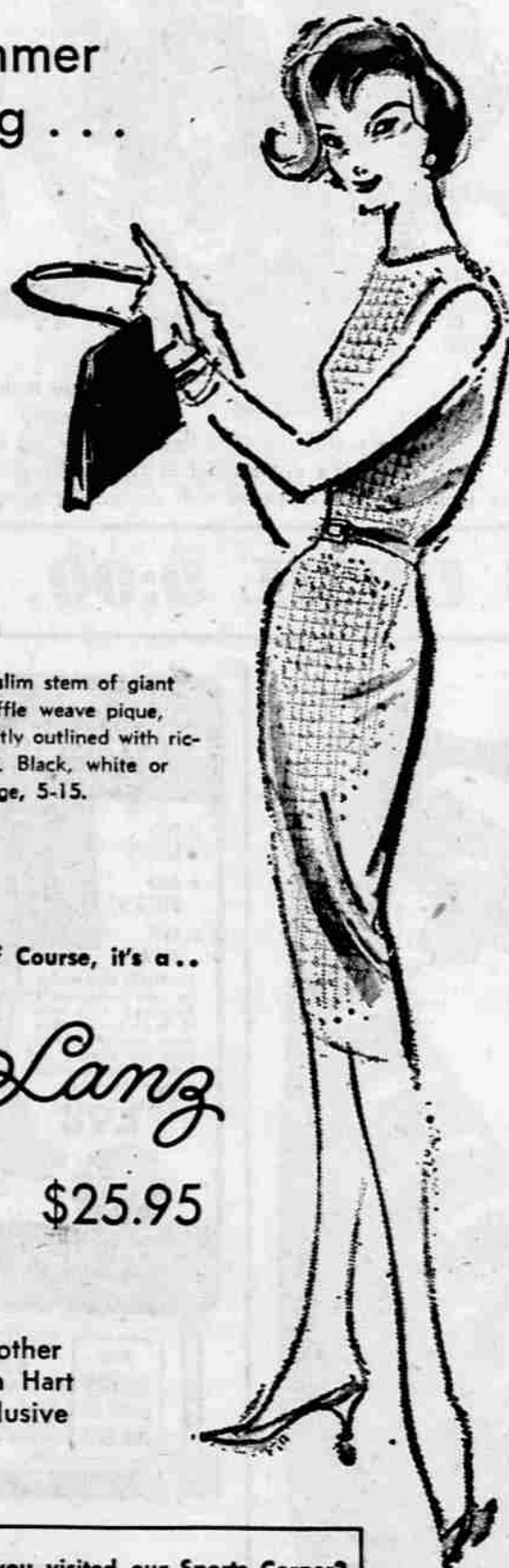
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
