Small Worlds Around Us

This Royal Couple Are Underground Prisoners. They have no desire to do so but this royal couple is permanently doomed to spend their entire lives within the narrow confines of their royal chamber. She, actually a terribly bloated, egg-laying machine, whose sole purpose is the production of eggs; he the king, her ever present consort but nonetheless a willing prisoner along with her.

At the time of the mating flight thousands of winged male and female termites were on the wing. Many were eaten by nighthawks, sparrows, toads and frogs. The pair who escape return to an underground burrow to become the king and queen of the termite society. Here their wings are torn off. They will never need them again.

When they entered the chamber, both were slender, thin-skinned male and female. Immediately they become residents here in the dark tunnel; the queen begins egg laying. Worker termites begin the construction of the royal chamber. An excavation is made.

Plastering Job. Next a group of termites begin the "plastering" of the walls. A separate class of termites does this job; peculiar looking, with the front ends of the heads elongated into a sort of nozzle arrangement. These nozzle-snouted members of termite society have the ability of squirting fluids with their peculiar-shaped mouths. They can spray either the cement like fluid

or one with a vile smell. With it they can dispel enemies; sort of a "chemical warfare" arrangement.

The fluid on the chamber walls hardens into a cement-like material. Passages leading in and out of this royal chamber are small, only large enough for the workers to enter and leave, but too small for the bloated, egg-laying queen who will be several times the size of any of her subjects. She becomes a prisoner and her mate, chained to her by the insistence of the watchful soldier termites, becomes a prisoner, too.

Their life together, and her egg-laying, may continue for 10 or more years. During all that time, there in the darkness of the royal chamber, she may produce a million or more eggs. When she is "going good" she may lay as many as 5,000 eggs in a 24 hour period.

At the end of her life she may be the mother of several million termites, none of which she has ever seen, for as fast as the eggs are laid the workers carry them away to special chambers where they are carefully tended until they hatch into tiny larva.

'Caste' Decided. Then the larva are watched over and fed, until such time as it is decided to which "caste" each will belong. Somewhere along the line of their early development they are fed regurgitated food which will contain a few protozoa; tiny animal organisms that will live in the termite's

Medford Youth to Get Bachelor's Degree

Phillip Sweet, Medford, will receive his bachelor of education degree at Whitworth college, Spokane, Wash., during commencement exercises Sunday, June 7.

He will be one of 176 receiving degrees, the largest number to receive degrees in the 69 year history of the liberal arts and science college.

By some unknown method the young will be delegated to one of four distinct "castes." Most will become "workers," dirty-white, soft bodied and sightless. The "soldier" caste is made of those stronger insects with biting mandibles. These are the defenders of the colony. They also construct the "tubes" that connect the underground den with the nearest wood supply. These "tubes" make it possible for the workers to go to and from "work" without getting out in the light. A third class is the "nozzle-noses," highly specialized insects with elongated snouts. And the most important "caste" of all — the paired king and queen; the Royal couple. It is a complex and highly workable government — the society of the termites.
