



'Supersonic Great-Grandmother,' 71, Prefers Jet Flight to Rocking Chair

George Air Force Base, Calif.—Mrs. Zaddie Bunker, 71, earned her right to the title of "Supersonic Great-Grandmother" yesterday when she cracked the sound barrier in an A-100F Super Sabre jet.

The flight, part of an armed forces day celebration at this desert base, marked the culmination of a long-time ambition held by the "grand old lady of flying."

She flew yesterday in an F-100F bearing the name "Zaddie's Rockin' Chair IV" and piloted by Lt. Col. Robinson Risner, 34, of Oklahoma City, Okla.

"It was the greatest ride I ever had in my life," exclaimed Zaddie, who actually held the stick when the jet broke the sound barrier. The Air Force said the F-100F traveled 800 miles an hour at an altitude of 35,000 feet in the supersonic burst at 1:55 p.m. PST.

Sailors in Suva Involved in Brawl

Suva—(UP)—Authorities in this Fiji Island port yesterday counted up the damages resulting from a brawl involving some 100 American sailors.

The fight broke out Friday night at a dance at the Suva town hall. Shrieking girls ran for cover as chairs and furniture were hurled across the room.

The Americans were from a destroyer division that docked here after a visit to Melbourne. They teamed back to San Diego yesterday.

Organizers of the dance criticized the Suva police. The Navy also was criticized for not sending shore patrols to the function.

Sheriff's Office Receives Total Of 189 Complaints

The Jackson county sheriff's office received 189 complaints during April and cleared 21 of them by arrests, according to the office.

The 189 is 64 more than received for April last year. The complaint total is also 24 more than received in March. Forty complaints were cleared during April, including some carried over from previous months.

Of the total, 104 were miscellaneous complaints, 23 were on felonies and 60 were on misdemeanors.

The sheriff's office issued 24 warrants and served 21. It also rendered 16 public services. A total of 217 civil papers were served.

Persons lodged in county jail during April totaled 51. Of this, 23 were lodged by the sheriff's office, 16 by state police, six by Medford police department, one each by Talent police department, FBI, Central Point police, and the parole officer. A total of 45 males were lodged in jail, three females and three juveniles.

Parents, Children Succumb to Smoke

St. Louis—(UP)—Five persons, including three children, were killed when fire swept through a one story frame home in suburban Riverview early yesterday morning.

The county coroner's office identified the dead as Mr. and Mrs. Robert Bennett, and their three children: Diane, 9, Robert Jr., 2, and Sherry, 1. The five died of smoke inhalation, the coroner's office said.

Call Girl Racket Crackdown Told

Portland—(UP)—A Portland vice squad crackdown on the call girl racket was disclosed late Friday with the arrest of three women on secret indictments returned by the Multnomah county grand jury.

Police listed the three women arrested as Margo Carol, 39, soliciting for a prostitute; Mery Ellen McKay, 33, bringing two persons together for immoral purposes; and Patricia F. Crawford, 22, being an immoral woman.

Deputy District Attorney Oscar D. Howlett said the call girl racket was the largest illicit business in Portland since the police campaign against houses of prostitution had dried up that source of vice.

He added that most of the call girls use some form of narcotics. He also said that since police closed the houses of prostitution there had been a notable increase in the rate of venereal disease.

Governor to Make Washington Trip

Salem—(UP)—Gov. Mark Hatfield will be in Washington, D.C. Monday and Tuesday for meetings of the Governors Conference Committee on Federal-State Relations.

Hatfield is one of 10 chief executives on the committee.

Foremost topics of the conference will be a review of legislative sessions, unemployment compensation, migratory labor, water problems and highway matters.

En route home, the governor will participate in a city Centennial luncheon upon the invitation of the mayor of Lansing, Michigan. Lansing is observing its 100th birthday anniversary this year and Hatfield will urge Michigan citizens to come to Oregon this summer during the exposition and trade fair.

The governor's final swing in promotion of the Centennial will come during the first week in June when he is scheduled for appearances in Pennsylvania, New York and Massachusetts on a combination of Centennial educational and Republican party appearances.

Rome—(UP)—French President Charles de Gaulle will arrive in Italy June 23 for a four-day state visit, a government spokesman said yesterday. The spokesman said De Gaulle would visit Milan and nearby World War II battlefields before coming to Rome.
