YREKA Annexation Approved

Yreka — The town of Yreka ballooned in area when residents to the west and north-west voted 41 to 32 to enter the city.
The city council will complete the annexation by canvassing the vote and accepting the area.
The vote by 73 persons represented almost 80 per cent of the area bounded by Lane st. to the south, Humboldt rd. on the north and uninhabited on the west.
No exact figure was available, but City Clerk Alton S. Taylor has taken a rough guess that the annexation will add 25 per cent more area to the city.

Funeral services were held May 13 in Grider's Funeral Chapel with the Rev. John S. Martin of St. Mark's Episcopal church officiating. Interment was in the Evergreen cemetery.
