

Father, 4 Children Die in House Fire

Ontario, Calif. (UP)—The father and four small children of a family which recently moved here from Missouri, were killed in their sleep Thursday night when fire swept their seven-room frame house.

Robert E. Burke, 29, truck driver at a nearby China poultry ranch, was found burned to death on a sofa in the living room of the modest home in this city about 45 miles east of Los Angeles.

A daughter, Barbara, 6, died in an adjoining bedroom. The three other children, all boys, were carried from the house by firemen but were pronounced dead of asphyxiation. They were Tony, 7; Terry, 4, and Bobby, 2.

The children's mother, Joan, 26, was working at her waitress job in a nearby restaurant when the blaze broke out shortly after 9:30 p.m.

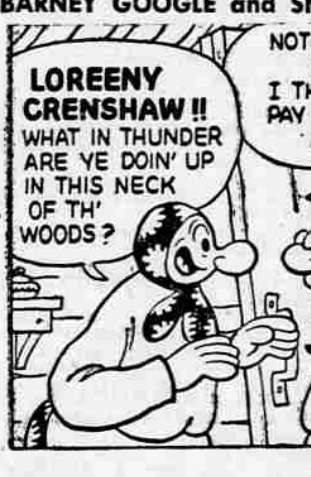
