Two Study Items Chosen By Oregon Voters' League

Two items for study by the League of Women Voters of Oregon were selected last week at the state convention held in Eugene. Over 100 official delegates from 16 leagues in the state were present.

Eight representatives attended from the Medford group.

Selected for study by all Leagues in the state for the coming two years were "Revision of the state constitution; reappraisal of methods of revision and study of the judicial branch" and "State's role in the problem of government for metropolitan areas."

The study of the judicial branch of the constitution is part of several years' work by League members. Study of the executive and legislative branches has been completed. The topic concerning the state's role in metropolitan areas grew out of studies by several local leagues which showed that solutions to fringe area problems are largely dependent on the state.

All Leagues throughout the United States are studying two national topics dealing with water resources and U.S. foreign policy. In addition, each group carries one or more local studies.

In Medford, the League is making a survey of Jackson county government with the intent of publishing a booklet for use of local citizens.

A skit written by Mrs. Ben Day, Sams Valley, was a feature of the Local League night at the convention. The brief "melodrama" presented locally to encourage passage of the County Home Rule amendment last November, was performed by Mrs. Thomas Rutter as county government; Mrs. John Ousterhout, the legislature; and Mrs. Robert Boyer, city government.
