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Six States Still Refuse To Comply With Integration Rule

New York—UPI—Five years ago the United States Supreme Court unanimously ruled that compulsory separation of the races is unconstitutional. When this decision was handed down on May 17, 1954, the laws of 17 states and the practice of the District of Columbia required the isolation of Negro public school children from children of other races.

Today six states (Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi, South Carolina, Louisiana and Florida) still refuse even token compliance with Supreme Court ruling as to elementary and high schools.

Florida has announced tentatively that it will desegregate one elementary school in Miami next September. Louisiana has Negro students in its state university and in several state colleges. Florida has two Negro university students. Therefore, in fact, only four states have no sort of desegregation in public education.

Far From Accurate

But a geographical summary is a far from accurate measure of the progress made in terms of numbers of students. In North Carolina, Virginia and Tennessee only token integration is in effect.

While some 400,000 Negro children are now in integrated systems in the South, there remains a total of 2,500,000 in strictly segregated situations. Measured in terms of the monolithic pattern of seg-

regation which existed five years ago, significant progress has been made. Measured in terms of the monumental job ahead, far too little progress has been achieved.

The opponents of integration can take small comfort from the present picture, for the forces arrayed against them must certainly prevail. Among these are law and morality, economics and science, the emergence internationally of a powerful anti-Western bloc, and the general trend of the mid-century toward the recognition of human dignity and individual liberty.

Segregation Opposed

Since its formation in 1909, the NAACP has opposed racial segregation in public education. We held then, as we do now, that compulsory segregation cheats Negro children of equal educational opportunities, deprives them of "equal protection of the laws," and handicaps them in our competitive free enterprise system.

That these children are eager to compete has been demonstrated again and again as they have braved humiliation and violence with dignity and restraint in order to enjoy their right to an unsegregated education. Some have made honor rolls, one in Oklahoma is a valedictorian, and others have gone on to college.

The United States needs, now more than ever, to demonstrate the fairness and freedom of the democratic system. But our Little Rocks and our mobs are spoiling the image we seek to present to the world. If the challenge of the

Communist dictatorship is to be met and thrown back, all our youth, regardless of race, religion or station, must have free access to the best of education and scientific training.

The NAACP and Negro Americans will not be satisfied and our country will not be at full strength, physically and spiritually, until every man, woman and child is equal before the law, with no exceptions, no trickery, no de-tours.

Communists May Be Responsible For Obscene Books

Washington—UPI—A witness told congressional investigators last week there are indications the Communists may be distributing obscene literature in this country as part of a deliberate effort "to morally sabotage American youth."

Dr. Clyde Taylor, public affairs secretary for the National Association of Evangelicals, asked a House post office subcommittee to look into the possibility.

Taylor was one of the several witnesses from church and civic groups demanding stronger legislation against smut peddlers.

Chairman Kathryn E. Granahan (D-Pa.) said she believed immediate action was called for to deal with the entire problem of obscenity.

Need For Crusade

"This hearing," she said, "should serve to point up the seriousness of the problem and the need for decent citizens everywhere to unite in a crusade against the dealers of smut and filth whose activities weaken the moral life of this nation."

Only a few days ago, she said, a grand jury in Detroit returned indictments against three Californians on charges of mailing information on lewd literature, some of which allegedly went to a 15-year-old boy.

The action was taken under a new federal law which permits prosecution at the point of delivery of such material.

OVERCOME BY 'PAY'

Hawthorne, Fla.—UPI—Police said "all he could drink" was just too much for Lee Douglas, 41, Douglas, a Negro, was charged with accepting \$8 and "all he could drink from a gallon of whiskey" for spreading a campaign rumor about the mayor. 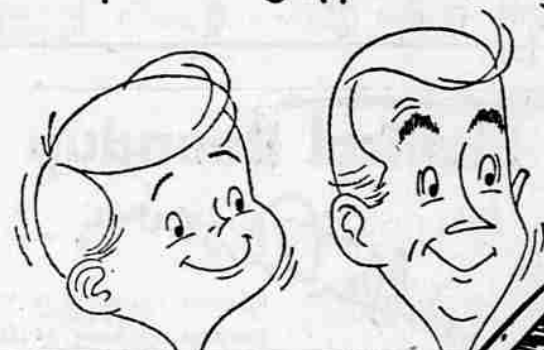
