Black Tornado 7th In Prep Golf Mix; Beaverton Titlist

Portland—UPI—Beaverton won the Oregon State high school golf championship at Glendover golf course here Tuesday with a two-round total of 607.
Lynn Yturri of Ontario captured the individual title with an eagle under the first nine holes and a birdie on each of the last five holes for a sizzling seven-under par 67. Coupled with Monday's 72, he finished with a 139, nine-under-par.
John Ketr of South Eugene was low after Yturri in the individual standings with 73-74—147. Doug Ragen, Oswego; Kermit Kelling of Beaverton and Mickey Shaw of Milwaukie finished with 148's.
Milwaukie Second
Milwaukie was second in team standings with 617 strokes. South Eugene placed third with 619 and Oswego was fourth with 627.

GP Places Four Men On All-Star

Medford High school's championship baseball team placed six men on the Medford Mail Tribune's 1959 Southern Oregon conference all-star aggregation.
Grants Pass, runner-up for the league and District 6 A-1 diadem put four players on the roster chosen by coaches and teams of the five member schools. Klamath Falls and Ashland each have two spots on the club.

Selected from Medford were pitcher Dick Hayes, catcher Gary Huneycutt, second baseman Lee Holmes and outfielder Rex Benner. Klamath Falls placed pitcher Blake Griggs and outfielder Rich Depew. The two utility positions on the squad went to infielder Harley Dickerson and outfielder Bob Johnson, both of Ashland.

All-Opponent Vote
Voting was done on an all-opponent basis. Under this system coaches and teams did not vote for their own players.

While 10 ballots were cast, a player could receive no more than eight votes. Getting this unanimous recognition from rival teams were Hayes, Griggs, Huneycutt, Pond and Lowell Dean.
Position of utility infielder was determined by total vote for infield positions after the regular spots had been filled. Dickerson was runner-up in second base balloting with three votes and got one at shortstop for his total of four. Johnson was named in the outfield as fourth in the voting for those positions.

In addition to the 14-man team, another 16 players received one vote or more in the poll and gained honorable mention.

Coaches voting were Dean White, Klamath Falls; John Kovenz, Medford; Mel Ingram, Grants Pass; Bill Leybold, Ashland, and Bill Piche, Crater.

The Mail Tribune tabulated the ballots.

Light Heavies Tangle Tonight

Fine Pitching Took North Bend's Nine To District Toga

North Bend High school will bring a young baseball team with a record of good pitching and with the ability to win close low scoring games when it engages Medford at the senior high diamond here on Friday in the Oregon Class A-1 championship quarter-finals.

The tangle will be at 3 p.m. and there will be a charge for admission. Medford school officials have announced.

The Bulldogs have a 14-win, 5-loss record for the 1959 campaign.
The top pitchers are Gary Wallace with an 8-2 mark and Tom Younker with 6-3. Younker, who plays in the outfield when not pitching, also heads North Bend in hitting with a .363 average on 16 hits in 44 times up. He is followed by Bill Swain with 13 for 42 or .309. Colin Rush follows with 12 for 45 or .266.

Three Common Foes
North Bend and Medford played three common foes during the season. Medford divided with Roseburg and North Eugene and won one and tied one against Springfield. North Bend took two from Roseburg and three of four from North Eugene.

Pitching has been the outstanding feature for the Bulldogs. Younker has allowed just two earned runs in 56 innings and Wallace only three in 55 2/3.

Among the players who may start are four sophomores, Ron Kersey and Chuck Johns, outfielders; Terry Leininger, shortstop, and Jeff Allen, second base. Mike Payne, catcher, and Rush, third base, are juniors.

Lawrence Defeats Coe in Tournament

Sandwich, England—UPI—Murray Lawrence of England produced the greatest upset of the 1959 British Amateur Golf championship today when he eliminated Charlie Coe, Oklahoma City, Okla., 1-up, in the third round.

Coe, captain of the victorious Walker Cup team and the American amateur king, was the tournament favorite.

Lawrence, almost unknown in British golf circles, surprised Coe by winning the first two holes and hit the turn with a 4-up lead. Coe got three of those back when Lawrence bogied the 10th, 11th and 12th holes.

However, the lanky American then took a double-bogey

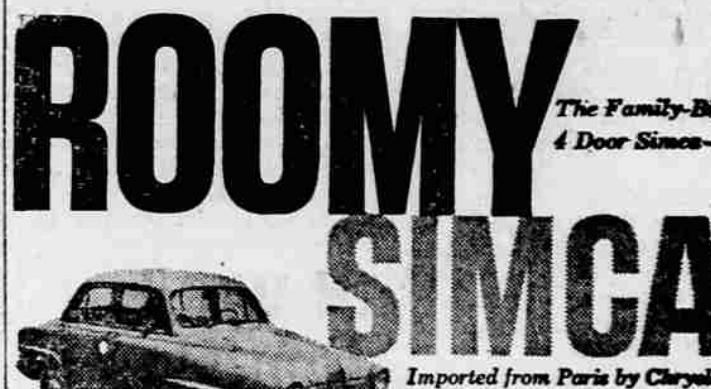
6 on the 13th that dropped him two behind. He won the 15th but then bowed out by halving the last three holes. On the final hole, Coe's second shot landed just off the green on a nasty down hill lie. He putted 20 feet short of the hole and missed his next putt that would have sent the match into extra holes.

Six Yanks in Fourth

Even if he survives this afternoon's fourth round, Lawrence may have to withdraw from the tournament to attend his father's funeral Thursday. The elder Lawrence died last Saturday.

Only six Americans reached the fourth round.

Highlands, Mass., turned back England's Fred Binns, 1-up.
