**Bills Signed By Hatfield**

Salem - (UPI) - Bills signed by Gov. Mark Hatfield Wednesday included the following:  
 Hearing aids: Hearing aid dealers will be licensed under another bill making Oregon the first state in the union to pass such legislation.  
 Convict Appeals: A simplified procedure for convicts seeking appeals after conviction was approved with en-

dorsement from the courts and the Interim Committee on Judicial Administration.  
 Trust Deeds: This bill will provide another method of financing homes in addition to mortgages.  
 Shoplifting: This bill will allow suspects to be detained for questioning without the chance of false arrest charges.  
 Coroner: Medical examiners will replace current coroners when their terms expire under terms of another bill. This, and companion legislation is designed to end the present coroner-funeral director tie-in. In most cases, county health officers would be the new medical examiners or could appoint a local M.D. to the job.  
 Tuesday the governor signed 77 bills.

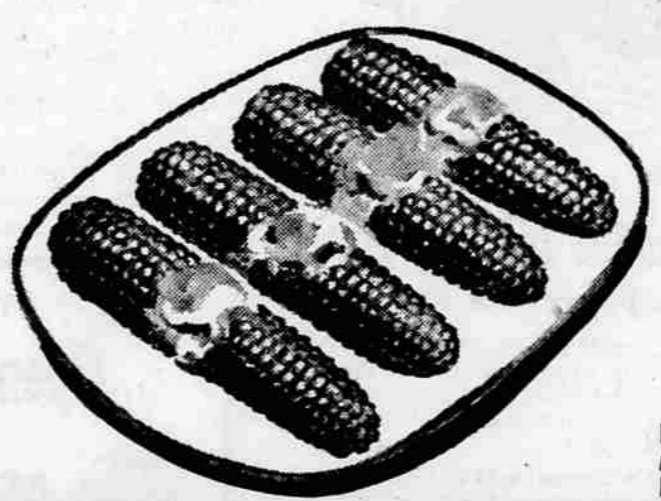
