

Medford Man Fined On Two Charges

Robert Harry Farnsworth, 41, of 4736 Table Rock rd., received a \$100 fine for driving under the influence of intoxicating beverages and a \$10 suspended fine for being drunk in public in Medford municipal court yesterday.

Farnsworth was arrested for being drunk in public, and also cited for having no operator's license, following an accident Wednesday between his vehicle and one operated by Ray I. Kimmey, route 1, box 120, Gold Hill, according to Medford police. Action on the citation was pending.

Kimmey filed a complaint against Farnsworth for driving under the influence Thursday in court. Farnsworth pleaded guilty to both the drunk in public and driving under the influence charges, court records show.

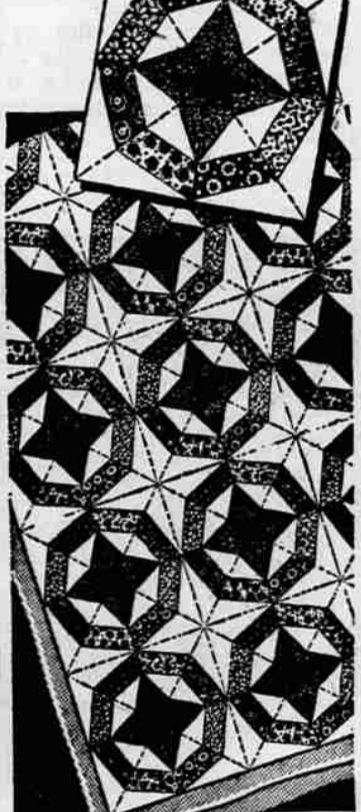

Eastern Oregon In Need of Rain

Portland—(UPI)—Unless plentiful rain falls on eastern Oregon ranges within the next month, big game animals will have a rough time next winter, according to John McKean, chief of the game division for the Oregon Game Commission.

McKean said lack of moisture and low temperatures this spring have retarded growth of both shrubs and grasses on most eastern Oregon big game ranges. He said spring food production is far below normal, and in the absence of rain during late May and June to give a boost to shrub and grass growth, critical conditions can be expected on many ranges next winter.

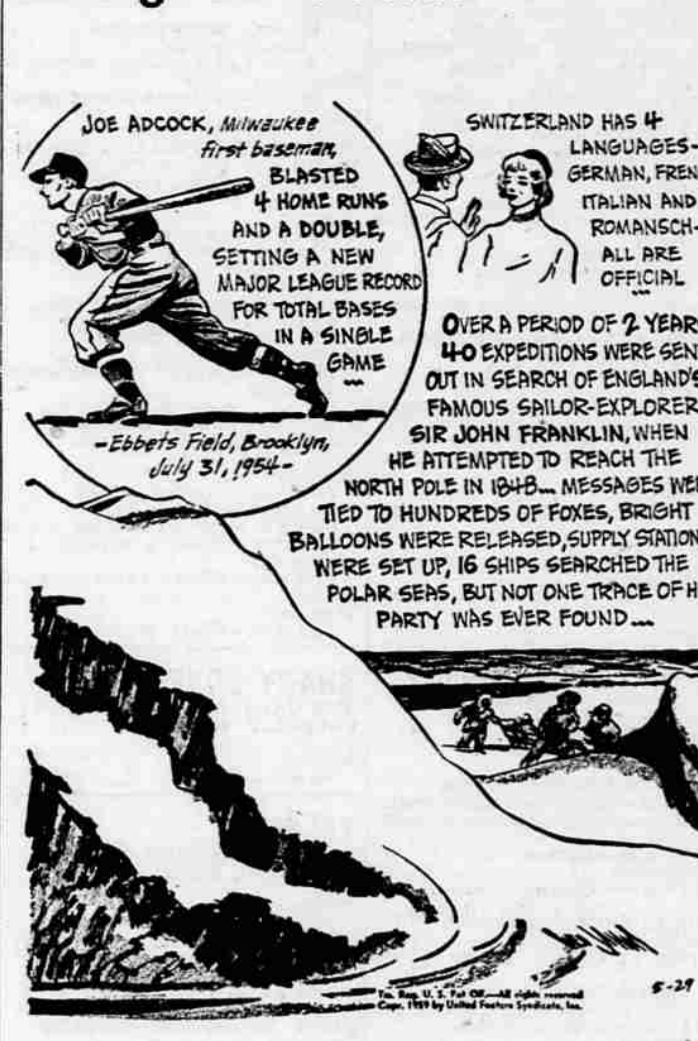
