

Fair Commission Awards Contracts

Salem—(UP)—The State Fair Commission has awarded Larry Allen, San Francisco, the night revenue contract for the next State Fair with a budget of \$25,000. Last year's budget was \$33,000.

Christenson Brothers, Eugene, was awarded the rodeo contract again. It calls for \$15,500, a \$500 increase from a year ago.

A 20 per cent cut in livestock premiums will be in effect this year, according to Howard Maple, fair manager.

Maple said that last year the premiums were increased 30 per cent but were trimmed down for this year's fair.

Gate admission charges will remain the same and there will be no night racing, the Commission ruled.

The Medical Roundup

A Remarkable Chemical Achievement

Dr. Klaus Hofmann, of the University of Pittsburgh Department of Chemistry, has recently synthesized a big complicated protein-like chemical. He did this by linking up a certain arrangement of 13 "amino-acids" — the building-blocks of those proteins which are so essential to the formation of our bodies. The substance synthesized is a hormone produced by the pituitary gland, which lies at the base of the brain just above the nose.

This hormone has to do with producing melanin, or the dark color in our skins. People who lack this hormone are albinos, with very white skins and colorless hair and eyes. Until a few years ago, most chemists would have thought that the synthesis of a large protein-like molecule would be impossible. The men who isolated the hormone from the pituitary gland were Dr. A. B. Lerner and T. M. Lee, of Yale. The persons who worked with Dr. Hofmann — with an American Cancer Society grant — were Miriam E. Woolner, Haruki Yajima, Gertrude Spulher, Thomas A. Thompson and Eleanor T. Schwartz.

Wetting The Bed

In a recent article by Rinvik and Steel in a Scandinavian Journal is a report of a study in a hospital of 186 children who wet the bed. Later, 122 parents reported that 20 per cent of the children studied had recovered; there was some improvement in 17 per cent, but the remaining 63 per cent were still bad off. Drugs were not much used, and little was expected of them. The main treatment was the ancient one of getting the child up at night to empty his bladder. Expert study of the bladders of the children showed abnormalities in nine out of 158. Twelve children were mentally retarded.

In 50 per cent of the cases, one or more members of the child's family had been bed-wetters. Obviously, there is a hereditary factor. I have found bed-wetting in 5 per cent of my patients who had mentally disturbed relatives. The authors doubted if it is much use to reduce the water intake of the children in the afternoons. Certainly, these children should never be punished, and life should never be made more miserable for them than
