## Gov. Long May Be Unable To Complete Term

Galveston, Tex. — (AP) — The acting Louisiana governor said today that Gov. Earl Long, mentally ill in a Galveston hospital, may be unable to complete his term of office.

Lt. Gov. Lethfranz, acting chief executive of the Bayou State in Long's absence, said it is possible the fiery 63-year-old Long may never serve another day as governor of Louisiana. His third four-year term ends in May, 1960.

**Announced Dangerous**

At the request of Long's family, Probate Judge Hugh Gibson Tuesday pronounced Long dangerous to himself and to others and ordered him committed for psychiatric treatment at John Sealy hospital here. The order said Long was mentally and physically ill.

The hospital said in a medical bulletin late Tuesday that chances for the colorful Louisiana political leader's recovery are "excellent."

At Baton Rouge, Frazar told United Press International "there is no doubt that he will be out for the rest of the fiscal session of the Legislature that has another two weeks to go, but nobody knows yet whether he will be able to serve out the rest of his term as governor of Louisiana."

"We hope that he will be able to return, but none of us are too hopeful. It is possible he has served his last day as governor. The main thing we all want is for him to recover his health."

**Wife Plans Return**

Mrs. Long, who has been at her husband's bedside since he was flown secretly to Galveston Saturday, was scheduled to return to the mansion in Baton Rouge today and talk to members of her husband's administration.

## Rackets Committee Calls Witness in Bribe Proposal

Washington — (AP) — Senate investigators today called an "extremely important" witness to testify how the Chicago underworld attempted to bribe public officials in an effort to operate pinball gambling and prostitution in Indiana.

Chief Counsel Robert F. Kennedy of the Senate Rackets Committee said the hearing would feature a recording in which a major underworld figure would be heard offering payoffs to the mystery witness, a Porter County, Ind., official.

He said the bribe offer, which occurred only last month, was rejected. He said the Chicago crime syndicate was trying to clear the way for pinball-prostitution operations in Porter county, near Chicago, in anticipation of a big industrial growth in the area.

Keenly told newsmen the syndicate apparently desired to duplicate in Porter county a vice monopoly that allegedly flourished in neighboring Lake County, Ind.

Witnesses testified Tuesday that former Lake County Prosecutor Metro Holovachka and other officials helped finance a pinball gambling operation that netted more than \$15 million in five years. They said similar assistance was rendered to juke box operators with Chicago underworld ties.

**Pressure on Chicago**

They said the prosecutor's tactics and pressure on owners to install the machines of favored operators.

## Space Monkey Has Successful Surgery

Pensacola, Fla. — (AP) — Baker, the smaller half of the U.S. space flying monkey team, successfully underwent surgery Tuesday and was pronounced in excellent shape.

The navy announced the one-pound squirrel monkey underwent a simple operation for removal of two electrodes without anesthesia.

Able, Baker's fellow monkey passenger on their historic 900-mile high ride inside a Jupiter missile last week, died Monday night during a similar operation in which anesthesia was administered. Able died on the operating table at Ft. Knox, Ky. Able was the heavier of the two, weighing seven pounds.

## Minister Faces Sentencing for Statutory Rape

Skowhegan, Maine — (AP) — The white-haired "fishing parson" of Maine will be sentenced today for the statutory rape of a 14-year-old girl who said she bore his child.

The Rev. Arthur MacDougall, 62, of Bingham, was convicted Tuesday night by a jury of five men and seven women who deliberated six and a half hours.

Dressed in a gray suit, the Congregational clergyman bowed his head as the verdict was pronounced. Somerset Judge Leonard F. Williams released the minister in \$10,000 bail for sentencing today.

**Maintains Innocence**

The Rev. MacDougall, widely known as the author of the "Dud Dean" outdoor stories, testified Tuesday in his own behalf and insisted he was innocent of charges of raping the young girl.

The prosecution charged in the two-day trial that the alleged rape occurred last July 20 when the girl came to the minister's summer home at Embden for help with her school homework.

The girl's mother, her stepfather and a cousin testified for the state that the Rev. MacDougall had admitted to them he was the father of a daughter born to the teenager last April 27.

But three of the minister's four children testified Tuesday that their father was at his Bingham home on the day of the alleged attack.

## Distance Flier Passes Trinidad

New York — (AP) — Commercial ferry pilot Mac Conrad, San Francisco, was reported today to have passed over the Trinidad, British West Indies, airport en route to Ft. Worth, Tex., from Coos Bay, Oregon, in an attempt to set a new distance record for a light, single-engine plane.

A representative of the Piper Aircraft company said Conrad's Piper Comanche plane was identified today by the Trinidad control tower.

Conrad had traveled 3,200 miles since his takeoff Tuesday morning and had 3,300 miles to go to set a record of nearly 7,000 miles nonstop.

The present record is held by Capt. Marion "Pet" Boling who made a 6,650-mile flight from Manila to Pearduvon, Ore., in a Beechcraft Bonanza last summer.
