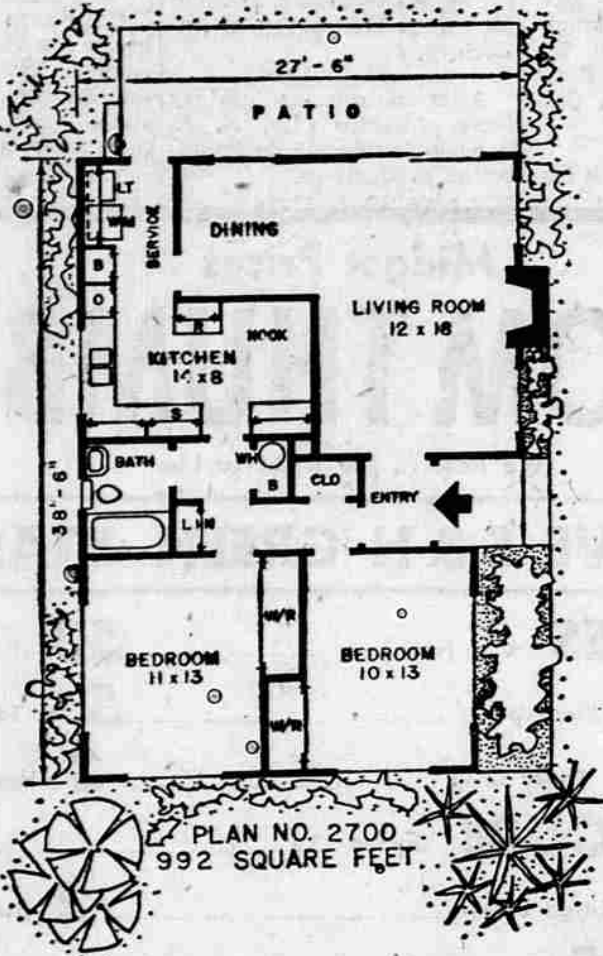
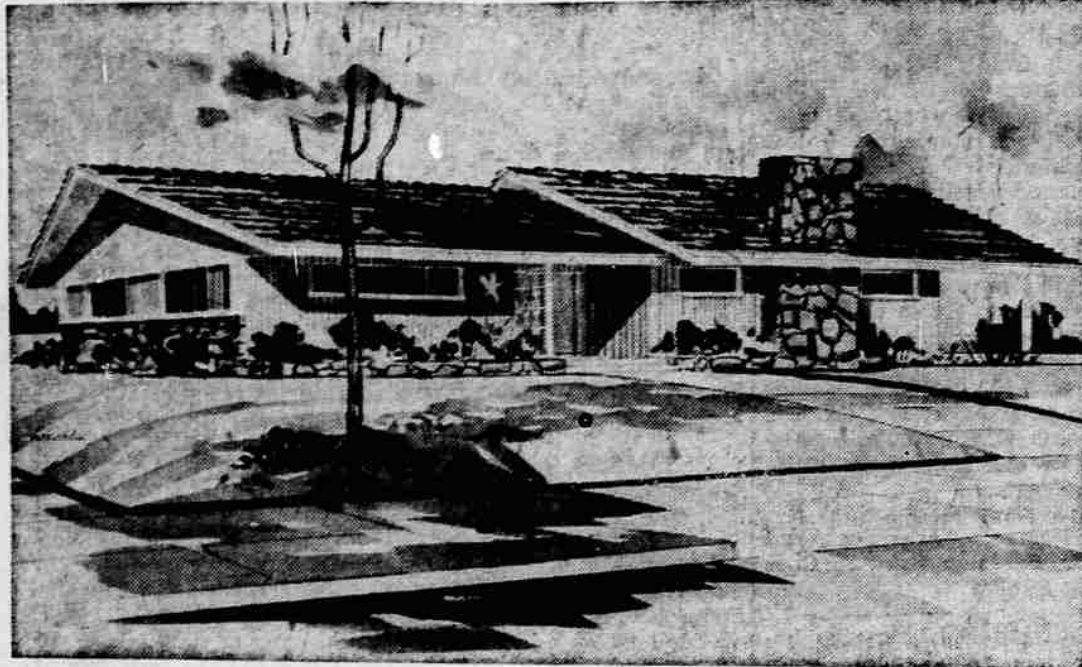


This Week's Home For Living



Here is a house that has been planned for the "Young in Heart." A home that will meet the requirements of either a small family or a retired couple.

The home has been primarily designed so that the bedrooms are located at the front of the lot and the living room faces the rear. In this position the some can be located on a rather narrow lot. However, for those who prefer a front living room and have a large building site, the plan could be rotated clockwise 90 degrees. Then, if preferred, the sliding doors can be replaced with windows and the patio eliminated.

The center hall plan has ample closet and storage space. All plumbing is centrally located for economy of construction. Wall heaters have been specified, but a horizontal forced air heater may be located in the attic space if this type of heating is desired.

A large eating area has been provided in the kitchen

along with built-in range and oven.

Cedar shingles are used as roofing material while aluminum casement windows, which are easy to clean and maintain, have been provided for light and ventilation.

A design of ornamental iron has been placed next to the double door entry.

Difficulty Seen for Strauss in Job

Washington—(UPI)—Sen. A. S. Mike Monroney (D-Okl.) said today the Senate fight over confirmation of Commerce Secretary Lewis L. Strauss would handicap Strauss in setting up new programs and policies.

Monroney took issue with President Eisenhower's news conference statement Wednesday that he did not believe Strauss' usefulness would be impaired by the Senate battle.

The Oklahoma Democrat agreed that Strauss, if he is confirmed, would be able to handle the routine administration of the Commerce Department without trouble.

But he said that the 9-8 margin by which the Senate Commerce Committee approved the nomination would haunt Strauss when he sought new authority or tried to adopt new programs for his department.

Elvis Presley May Keep Tonsils

Frankfurt, Germany—(UPI)—Elvis Presley, hospitalized by tonsillitis, will not have to undergo an operation on the golden throat which has made him a rich man, an Army spokesman said today.

The loose-hipped rock 'n' roll singer was admitted to the 97th General Hospital here Wednesday after running a 102-degree fever.

Army physicians said that Presley has an infection of the throat in addition to inflamed tonsils. The initial examinations indicated his case was not serious.

"He is undergoing treatment for both ailments," said a spokesman for the 3rd Armored Division in which Presley serves.

"The doctors have decided that an operation is not necessary," he added, however, that if Presley does not react favorably to the treatment, the question of removing his tonsils will have to be reconsidered.

Tarzan, Actress Wife in Separation

Hollywood—(UPI)—Actress Vera Miles and her movie husband, Gordon Scott, have separated.

"Just chalk it up to one of those things," said Miss Miles when she made the announcement Wednesday night. "Maybe a trial separation will do us good."

She said she was withholding a decision on whether to file for a divorce until she sees how the trial separation works out.

Interstate Bridge Tolls Opposed

Portland—(UPI)—Portland and Vancouver, Wash., pledged united efforts Wednesday to oppose tolls on the new Interstate Bridge across the Columbia river.

Mayor Irving Jensen and Vancouver city councilmen called on Portland city council members and said the two cities should work for legislative changes to have the bridge paid for from federal highway funds.

Polaris Subs To Have Check System

Groton, Conn.—(UPI)—The nation's first Polaris missile submarine, George Washington, to be launched June 9, will have a traffic light watchdog system constantly checking the readiness of its rockets. The "automatic check-out and readiness equipment" will put each rocket through a checking sequence. If the light registers "VGO," the computer will proceed to the next checking step. Should the light show "no go," it will automatically diagnose the trouble and sound an alarm.

Each of the 16 missiles carried by the submarine will receive periodic checks by the diagnostic electronic brain in a 24-hour watch over the two-stage rockets which have a target range of 1,500 miles.

The checking system is being developed by Lockheed Missiles and Space Division, Sunnyvale, Calif.
