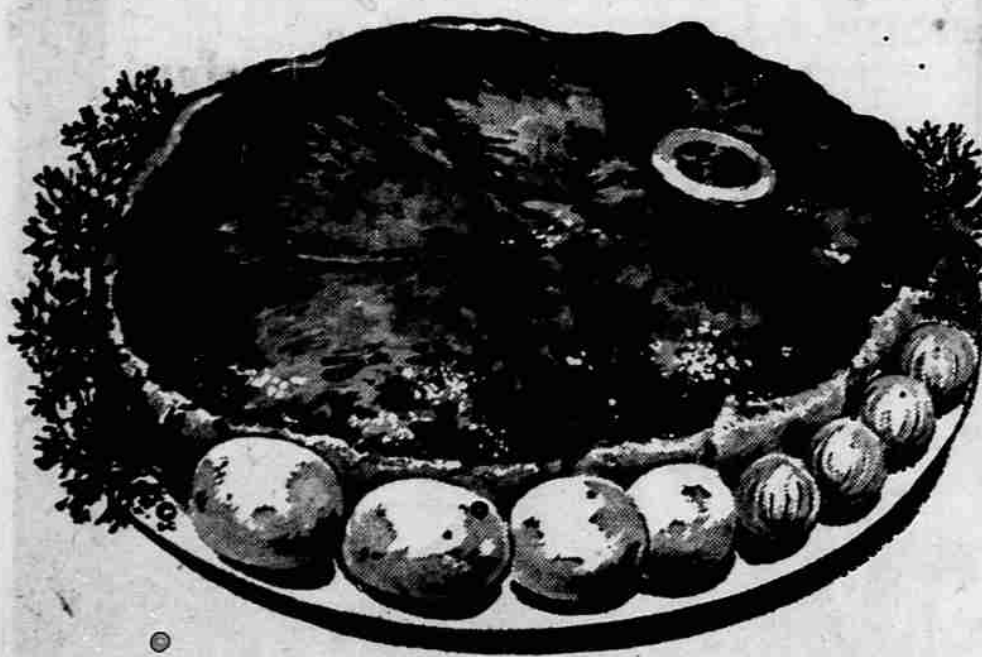

Reforestation in Rogue River Forest Progresses on All Fronts

Reforestation efforts on the Rogue River National Forest have moved ahead on several fronts during the current fiscal year, according to Forest Supervisor Carroll E. Brown.

More than 2,100 acres were planted with over a million nursery-grown tree seedlings during the past spring and fall. An additional 200 acres were hand-seeded using 400 pounds of locally collected tree seed. Most of this acreage had been deforested by clear-cut logging of mature timber. A small portion, about 200 acres, was brushfields that had been cleared by bulldozing, spraying or other methods.

The following species of trees were planted: ponderosa pine, Jeffrey pine, sugar pine, white pine, Douglas-fir and Shasta red fir. It is desired to plant the most desirable tree species for each particular site and one that will provide the most volume and value of wood at the time of harvest, Brown said.

Pine Hybrids Planted
Nearly 3,000 pine hybrids, which were crosses of northern and southwestern pines and show superior growth characteristics as well as some resistance to drought and insect damage, were planted on selected areas over the forest. The hybrids were developed at the Institute of Forest Genetics at Placerville, Calif.

A seed orchard was established this spring with over 400 young white pines grafted to what appears to be blister rust resistant stock, Brown said. Early cone production can be secured in this manner. The young seedlings so produced will be tested for

the transmission of resistance to the rust. This is known as the Jim Creek Seed orchard and is located on the Prospect ranger district.

Another unusual project on the Rogue River National Forest is at O'Brien creek on the Applegate district. Fifty cone flowers on several knobcone pines were "bagged" and later fertilized with pollen from Monterey pines from the central coast area of California.

Knobcone Now Present
Knobcone is present on some of our dry, rocky slopes but is a tree of little commercial value. Monterey pine is very fast growing and it is hoped that the resulting hybrid will prove to be a desirable forest tree on many of the poorer sites, Brown said.

Nearly 800 pounds of tree seed was purchased locally last fall from Fir Seed Incorporated, at Shady Cove. This seed will be used to grow planting stock at the two forest service nurseries in the northwest and for additional tree seedling work locally. The seed when kept under controlled refrigeration conditions will remain in good condition up to 10 years.

To reclaim old brushfields that had been deforested, by early fires, over 100 acres was aerially sprayed in the Butte Falls area. Various dosages of brush-killing sprays were tested. A near 100 per cent kill of specific brush species was accomplished.

Similar Size
Another area of similar size in the Union Creek area was prepared for tree planting using logging tractors with brush blades or special ground preparation equipment.

Detailed cost data was collected on the various types of projects to plan future work of a similar nature, the supervisor said. The areas were planted last fall.

New York — (UPI) — Holiday U.S.A., Wednesday night's CBS-TV special, was a lettuce-and-tomato kind of show: hot weather, slapped together, not particularly nourishing, acceptable only if you're heat-beat and willing to let your standards skid.

It was one of those programs in which a group of performers — Gisele MacKenzie, Burl Ives, Eddie Hodges — obviously were signed up in advance without much idea of what would be done with them. As a result, nothing much was done. The combatants were flung into a series of musical numbers, none wholly diverting, and all of it wound up looking like a soggy one-hour version of Your Hit Parade.

Had Fair Moments
The show had a scattering of fair moments: Jacques D'Amboise and Diana Adams danced briefly, but well. The U.S. Naval Academy glee club ground out a few pleasant pieces with the unhelpful assistance of Burl Ives. And the Red Nichols group turned out some acceptable music, marred only by Ives' insistence on singing with the band. As a jazz singer, Ives has about as much feeling as Carmen Lombardo.

As for Eddie Hodges, the youngster who was on board, I suggest it is about time he be retired. He is a clean-cut looking boy, but beyond his hygienic attributes, his talents are slim. His singing has that particularly irritating kind of quality that is best put to use in calling stray dogs.

Actor Arrested As Drunk Driver

Beverly Hills, Calif. — (UPI) — British actor Anthony Steel, former husband of Swedish beauty Anita Ekberg, was to appear in court today on a drunk driving charge.

The handsome actor was arrested on suspicion of drunk driving on Sunset blvd. minutes before midnight. A police officer said he chased Steel for two miles after he spotted the actor's pink Cadillac convertible "weaving from side to side."

Steel, 40, was held in jail pending his court appearance. On Dec. 15, 1956, Steel was arrested on a similar charge and was bailed out of jail by Miss Ekberg. The couple was divorced last month.
