

Methodists Close Conference With Reading of Appointments

Robert Dowrey has been assigned as assistant minister at First Methodist church, Medford, it was announced Sunday during the reading of appointments at the close of the annual conference of the Methodist church held in Medford last week.

Mr. Dowrey is currently a student at Garrett Biblical Institute, Evanston, Ill., and is expected to arrive in Medford later this month to assume his new duties.

The only other change in the Eugene district was the appointment of James G. Eubanks Jr. as minister of the Gold Hill Methodist church, Superintendent Assigned.

The Rev. Meredith A. Groves, superintendent of the Eugene district for several years, was assigned to the Coordinating Council of the church in the Portland office.

The Oregon annual conference next year will be held in Portland. More than 345 lay and ministerial delegates registered for the five day conference here. This was the first Methodist conference held in Medford in more than 20 years.

"I have faith in the victory of man predicated on Him who is our leader," Bishop A. Raymond Grant declared Sunday in the final sermon of the Oregon Conference of the Methodist Church.

The bishop of the Portland area discussed "On to the Next Adventure" at the service held in the Medford High school auditorium. He pointed to the need of "the deep rooting in the past" and of "courage in the present in looking into the future."

"God is counting on us. I'm sure, not to make the next generation the last," Grant said. He spoke of Christian love or compassion as a reason for living and as a basis for courage and stated, "It is Christ who brings the great dimension in our lives."

The bishop told his congregation that "the church needs us tirelessly committed to deathless causes" in the challenging and demanding present. "We can be depositors in a spiritual bank and, when needed, draw upon the resources," he said.
