Seven Persons Hurt In Medford Crashes

Seven persons were injured in four Medford traffic accidents Friday afternoon and evening, city police reported.

Three of the accidents, causing all but one of the injuries, reportedly occurred in the same quarter hour.

Three persons were hurt when an automobile and truck collided on North Pacific highway about 2:45 p.m., according to one report.

The automobile's driver, Victor Isaac Eakin Jr., 24, of 917 West 11th st., was cited for an improper left turn into the wrong lane after he drove his car from Sage rd. onto the highway, police reported.

The northbound truck, operated by Wenting Charles Hilkey, 36, of route 2, box 560, Central Point, reportedly pulled to the right to avoid Eakin's car, slammed into a culvert in front of Industrial Air Products company and jack-knifed. Eakin's car flipped into the ditch beside the road and landed upside down in water.

Eakin suffered a wrenched neck, cuts, and abrasions and contusions of the head, according to the report. His mother, Margaret Marie Eakin, 59, suffered a broken left knee and ankle and multiple abrasions. Both were taken by Medford Ambulance to Sacred Heart hospital, where they were reported in good condition last night. Their car was reported a total wreck.

Hilkey was taken by police to Medford Osteopathic hospital, where his injuries were described as "minimal." Injuries to two.

About five minutes before this accident, according to another report, a collision at Kennet and Boardman sts. resulted in injuries to two persons.
